

News About Books From the Library

A new method of book ordering has been adopted by the Medford Public library which makes it possible for library patrons to ascertain in advance what titles are to be added to the book collection.

At the same time that an order is forwarded to the jobber, a duplicate slip is now filed in the library's card catalog indicating that the book will be purchased. Reserve requests may be placed for any book on order as well as for any book already received.

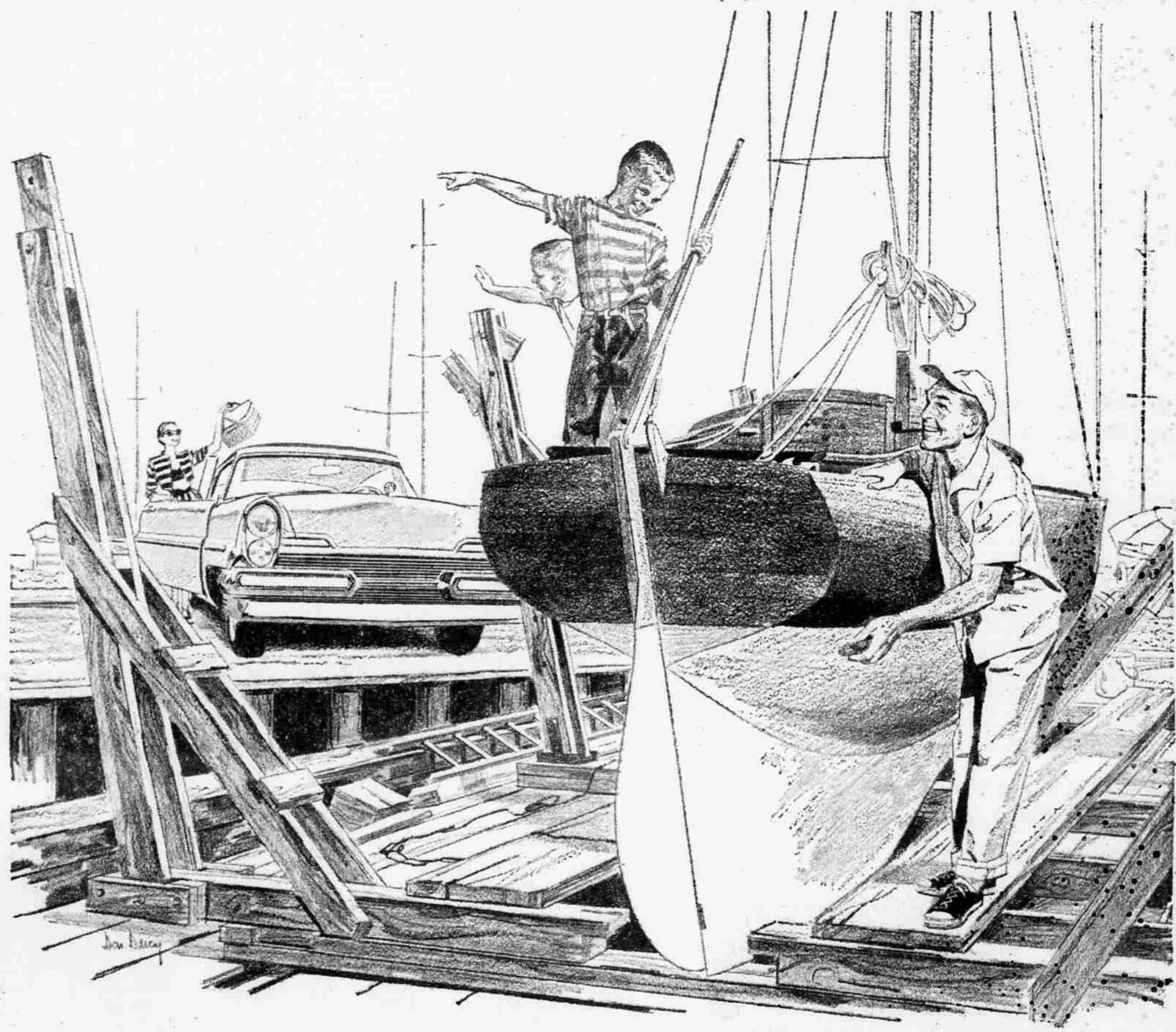

Troops Must Leave At Once, Pravda Says
London—(U.P.)—The Soviet newspaper Pravda demanded today that Anglo-French and Israeli troops leave Egypt at once or face possible intervention by Soviet "volunteers," radio Moscow reported.
"The Soviet people realize where the extension of a military conflict in Egypt may lead if a rebuff is not given to the aggressors threatening the destiny of the world," the official organ of the Soviet Communist Party said in an editorial.

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
