

Fire Levels Dormitory Buildings At Women's College in Missouri

Fulton, Mo.—AP—A raging fire early today left the central group of freshmen dormitory buildings on the campus of William Woods College for Women "a total loss."

Officials said the fire was brought under control at about 1:30 a.m. (PST). They said the main freshmen

dormitory, Jones Hall, and North Jones Hall burned to the ground, as well as the adjacent campus dining room and kitchen.

Another Still Standing
Another dormitory, Edwards Hall, just south of the other buildings, was also damaged but was still standing.

Six roll calls were taken of women students housed in the buildings destroyed. They were all reported safe and accounted for.

Damage was unofficially estimated to be at least \$1 million to the buildings. No estimate was made on the personal belongings of the students and school personnel, but it was reported that "nothing of any value was saved."

Fire officials said cause of the fire was believed to have been defective wiring in the basement of Jones Hall. They said the fire spread rapidly through the 60-year old red brick buildings and was out of control within 15 minutes after it started about 8:30 p.m. (PST) Monday.

The Fulton Fire Department was aided by emergency manpower and equipment from neighboring Mexico and Colum-

bia, Mo. departments, as well as by scores of students from Westminster College for Men, also in Fulton. Firemen said the Westminster students were "invaluable" in fighting the blaze.

Two unidentified Westminster men were reported to have been injured by flying debris, but officials said they were not in need of hospitalization. Students and officials said the

fire "curiously" coincided with the annual "hell day" when freshmen girls are put through the usual hazing routines by seniors at the two-year college. Although no connection was made

between "hell day" and the cause of the fire, officials said they planned an investigation of several "phony" fire alarms turned in from the college all day Monday.

TRAIN WRECK HURTS SIX
Tampa, Fla.—AP—A miniature train overturned Monday night at an amusement park, injuring six persons, one seriously. Mrs. Lillie Koga, 60, was taken unconscious to a hospital with head injuries. Six cars of the eight-car train, turned over

Four Escape Death In Columbia River

Hood River—AP—Four persons narrowly escaped drowning in the Columbia river near here yesterday when rough water upset their 21-foot sailboat.

The Hood River county sheriff's office said John Arens, Hood River accountant, his two daughters, and Jean Manguin, an exchange student from France, were spilled into the cold water when the boat upset.

Arens and Manguin managed to tread water and keep the two children afloat until rescuers reached them. The rescuers witnessed the accident from shore and put out in a boat from the Nichols boat works.

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Republicans Gain In Washington County

Hillsboro—AP—Republicans have picked up another seat in the State House of Representatives after an official tabulation of votes in Washington county.

The official count gave the seat to John D. Messer, Portland attorney. Unofficial counts released earlier had listed Democrat James R. Shick, of Forest Grove as the winner.

The new tabulation raised the number of Republican seats in the House to 22. Official tabulations in Lane county last Saturday had reversed an announced result there with Edwin E. Cone, Republican, winning reelection over C. A. Paddock, Democrat, of Oakridge, in the official canvass of votes.

Telephone Service Restored in Hungary

Vienna—AP—Telephone communications with Hungary were restored today for the first time since the Soviet Army moved in to crush the Hungarian revolt Nov. 4.

Vienna long distance exchange reported, however, there were "very long delays" even on urgent rate calls.

The U.S. embassy here announced that several officials of the U. S. legation at Budapest will return to their posts Wednesday.

U.S. Minister Thomas Wailes and a number of others remained in Budapest throughout the uprising.

Fair Trial Said Assured Newsmen in Nicaragua

Havana, Cuba—AP—Guillermo Martinez Marquez, new president of the Inter-American Press Association, said today a three-man subcommittee has been named to assure a fair trial for eight Nicaraguan newsmen imprisoned on charges of complicity in the assassination of President Anastasio Somoza.

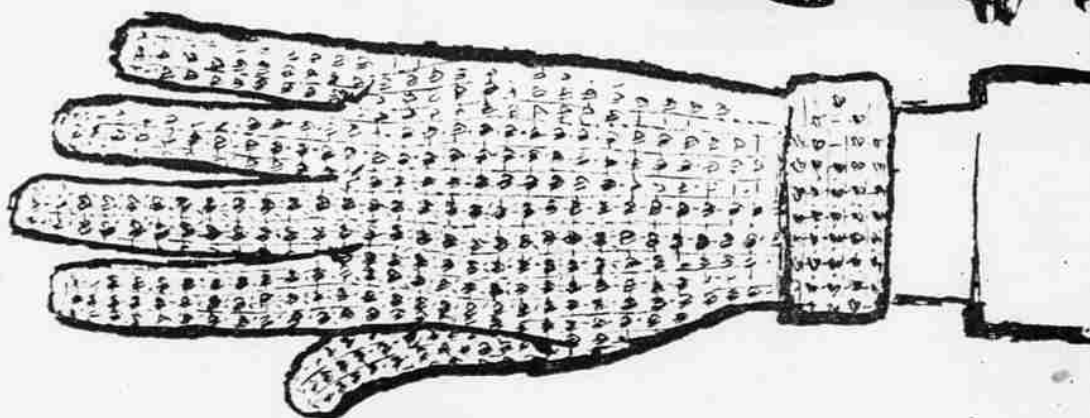
