Mrs. Stan Smith, president, spoke of the importance of the school census.

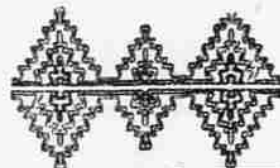
Mothers of children in the third grade served refreshments.

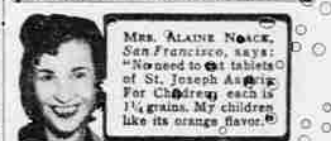
