The dance is an annual event sponsored by the student council of the school. Music was provided by the John Lusk orchestra.

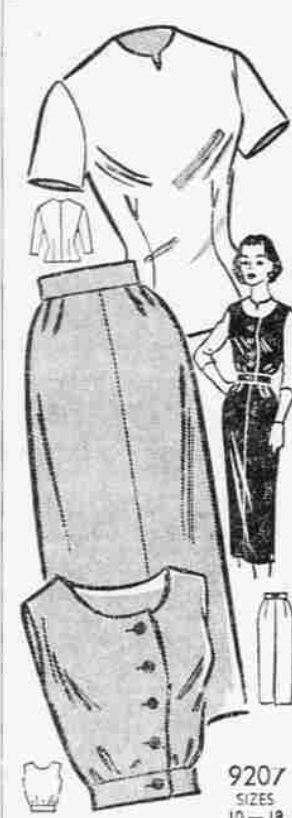
Pears Tasty Addition To Salad of Greens

New York —(U.P.)—Pears now coming to the nation's markets make a tasty addition to a mixed green salad.

Here's how: Tear well-washed greens into pieces in a salad bowl. Cut a couple of pears into cubes and add them to the greens, along with a handful of watercress and some coarsely chopped walnuts. Drizzle olive oil on the salad (enough so the leave will be coated when the salad is tossed). Sprinkle with salt and pepper and squeeze lemon juice over all. Toss well and serve immediately.
