

### \$23,892 Suit Filed Against Company In Circuit Court

A \$23,892.58 suit has been filed in circuit court here against White City Realty company and James M. Main, trustee in bankruptcy for Laughlin Alloy Steel Co., Inc.

Plaintiffs in the case are Robert R. and Alicia V. Carter, doing business as Industrial Machine and Pump company, 2940 North Pacific highway.

The complaint states that on July 15, 1955, Laughlin Alloy Steel Co., Inc. agreed to pay the plaintiffs costs of labor and materials in construction of a steel foundry on property the steel company had leased from White City Realty company.

The plaintiffs claim the steel firm paid only \$14,956.17 for materials and labor. They also claim total value of labor and materials was \$33,938.75.

**On May 12, 1956, the Carters abandoned the foundry construction project and filed an \$18,982.58 lien against the property. The complaint states the realty company had knowledge of the foundry construction project, consented to it and gave no notice that it would not take responsibility for the construction.**

The plaintiffs are asking judgment in the amount of \$18,982.58 plus 6 per cent per annum interest, from May 12, 1956, until paid, for materials and labor in the foundry construction, \$5,000 attorneys' fees, and sale of the foundry to cover any further judgment the court may award.

Attorneys for the plaintiffs are Neff, Frohnmayer and Lowry.

Laughlin Alloy Steel Co., Inc. entered bankruptcy on July 6, 1956, and Main was named trustee in bankruptcy for the firm on Sept. 7.
