

Monaco Inhabitants Have Unhappy Feeling Impending Birth Won't Seem Important

Monte Carlo — (AP) — Just a few weeks back it seemed so important: Will Princess Grace have a boy, a girl or, best of all, twins. Now the inhabitants of romantic little Monaco have the unhappy feeling that a world caught in crisis really doesn't care a great deal. The people of Monaco were taking the scheduled February arrival of a new heir to the Grimaldi throne seriously. So seriously they were investing money in preparation for throngs expected here for the logical follow-up to last spring's wedding. Two rooms for nursery

When Prince Rainier and the princess return here Friday from the United States, they will find two rooms of the palace converted into a nursery. The rooms formerly were museum-like galleries open to the public. They have been decorated in blue and pink—suitable for either sex. The palace has undergone a thorough scrubbing and waxing throughout its 200 rooms. The public has been barred at considerable loss of revenue. The frescos in the royal courtyard have been carefully restored by two Louvre experts from Paris. A new movie house, Europe's plushiest, has been built under-

ground. It is beneath the famous sporting club. Decorated in the Monacan colors, red and white, it cost almost \$250,000. It has a royal box with adjoining royal bathrooms and sitting rooms. Across the square, the faded old gambling casino is getting a Las Vegas transfusion. Casino President Pierre Rey has gone to Nevada to find out what makes gambling there so popular and profitable. The picture-card harbor has been getting a going over, too. A pile driver has been winking the populace and the few tourists daily at dawn in the work of enlarging a quayside. Huge cranes have been used in the demolition of the old and ugly gas works that has stood on the waterfront for three generations. Monte Carlo hopes the world comes to its senses soon enough to appreciate a really important event.

U.S. Expects Israel To Pull Troops Out Of Gaza Strip Area

Washington—(AP)—The United States expects Israel to pull its troops out of the Gaza Strip as part of its agreement to withdraw forces from Egypt, officials disclosed today. Israel has indicated it might try to retain military control of the 50-mile long area on the Mediterranean coast. Israeli forces captured it when they penetrated Egypt Oct. 29. Israeli Foreign Minister Golda Meir has declared that the strip is an integral part of Israel. Support Troop Withdrawal Asked whether the United States would support Israeli occupation of the Gaza Strip, U.S. officials noted that the United Nations had called for withdrawal of Israeli forces behind the 1949 armistice lines. "We support that," one official said. A withdrawal to the 1949 ar-

mistice lines would mean pulling Israeli troops out of the Gaza Strip. Before the Israeli attack, the area was under British government control, but it was not a part of Egypt's sovereign territory. U.S. views on the Gaza area presumably have been made clear to Israel through diplomatic channels. State department officials have been in close contact with the Israeli embassy in recent days. France also may be hearing about Washington's position on the Gaza Strip. Officials were clearly disturbed by dispatches out of Paris Tuesday. These dispatches quoted French Foreign Minister Christian Pineau as saying the United States considers the Gaza area part of Palestine and, therefore, Israeli troops are not expected to pull out of the strip.

Ingrid Bergman Rests After Surgery

Paris—(AP)—Ingrid Bergman underwent an emergency appendicitis operation early today. Hospital authorities reported she was in good condition. A spokesman for the American hospital in suburban Neuilly said the 41-year-old Swedish actress was resting comfortably. Miss Bergman, who had been ailing since Saturday, was rushed to the hospital Tuesday morning. She was in Paris rehearsing for the French version of Robert Anderson's play, "Tea and Sympathy." She was to act the leading female role, created by British actress Deborah Kerr on Broadway. The operation was expected to postpone the opening of the play. Miss Bergman is the wife of Roberto Rossellini, Italian producer.

Emergence of New World Power Seen As Outgrowth of Present Problems

London — (AP) — The emergence of an independent force outside the "umbrellas" of either Russia or the United States was forecast for the semi-official international study group here today. Memoranda compiled by the group and made available to British government departmental heads and members of Parliament has developed the thesis that both the great powers face rifts with their allies which will hasten important changes in the distribution of world power. Counter to Interests The group's study has taken into account current events in Poland, Hungary and the Middle East which they see as running directly counter to the interests of both the United States and Russia. These events, the group says, show that both the United States and Russia became over-extended. As the prospect of war between the United States and Russia decreased, so the need for forward bases declined.

Countries which, under the threat of war, could be counted on to do the great powers' bidding are now choosing their own roads. The study group believes that the outcome of the present crisis will be greater independence for the Soviet satellites and more liberty of action by the allies of the two great powers. A Prediction It predicted that the Middle East, like Eastern Europe, will go its own way but veer towards the West; that Britain will associate more closely with continental Europe, and that Red China will attain the true status of a great power — independent of Russia. The study group sees the reunification of Germany as the key to this eventual transformation of world power. It forecasts that the East Germans must finally succumb to the great and constantly increasing economic pull of West German prosperity. The Suez Canal is seen as a critical component of Western European strength and, there-

fore, figures in the future reunification of Germany and the consequent liberation of Eastern Europe. But while Suez is recognized as the lifeline for Europe, the study group sees lines of communications which are equally as critical to the two great powers. Russian Worries Russia is seen as worried about Outer Mongolia over which there has been a long struggle with Red China. The study group believes Peiping has the upper hand in the struggle which places the Communist Chinese in a position to threaten Russia's communications to the Far East. The group believes the United States is looking warily at the Panama Canal, which could reasonably become the vortex of a new crisis. Another consequence of the Suez crisis seen by the group has been Japan's "scooping" of European contracts east of Suez. They also see Japan keeping a watchful eye on the movement towards a free trade area in Europe which would prompt the

promotion of a like area in the Orient. This, the group believes, would bring the erstwhile Japan-East Asia "co-prosperity sphere" back into the picture.

Auto Joyride Causes Round of Excitement

Pittsburgh—(AP)—Two teenagers couldn't understand the fuss when they were arrested Tuesday for taking a joyride in somebody else's automobile. The theft had most of the available Pittsburgh police force hunting them down. An obliging officer explained—the vehicle they had stolen had, locked in its trunk, \$61,400 in negotiable American Express Co. money orders. Gerald McDaniels had left the money orders in the car when he went to make a collection at a company's substitution. Kenneth Fisher and Louis Hatton, both 18, readily admitted to a lesser charge of automobile larceny. "We only went for a little ride," one tried to explain.

Changes in Poland Show Soviet Action To Be Unexpected

Warsaw — (AP) — A new and more liberal government assumed power today in an apparent indication that Polish leaders do not feel the Russians will make Poland into another Hungary. Most of the stern "Stalinists" of the former regime were missing from the cabinet of Premier Josef Cyrankiewicz, Soviet-trained Marshal Konstantin Rokossovsky, the unpopular defense minister, lost that post and also gave up his job as vice premier. Going to Moscow The changes were announced Tuesday night in the Sejm (Parliament) as Titoist Communist Party leader Wladyslaw Gomulka prepared for a trip to Moscow and talks with the Soviet leaders. Rokossovsky, a favorite of Moscow, resigned in favor of Gen. Marian Spychalski a friend

of Gomulka. Both Spychalski and Gomulka were once disgraced for "Titoism" and, only recently rehabilitated. Rokossovsky's resignation had been predicted for weeks—ever since Gomulka resumed power. But the 60-year-old marshal, twice a hero of the Soviet Union, remained in his post as defense minister until Tuesday as a concession to Moscow. To Ask Intentions Informed circles said Gomulka and Cyrankiewicz would leave for Moscow Thursday or within the next few days. They were expected to ask about Russian intentions toward Poland. The Poles have shown more sympathy with the Hungarians than have any other East European countries, but Gomulka and other Communist leaders have tried to restrain public feeling to prevent a repetition here of the Soviet move in Hungary.

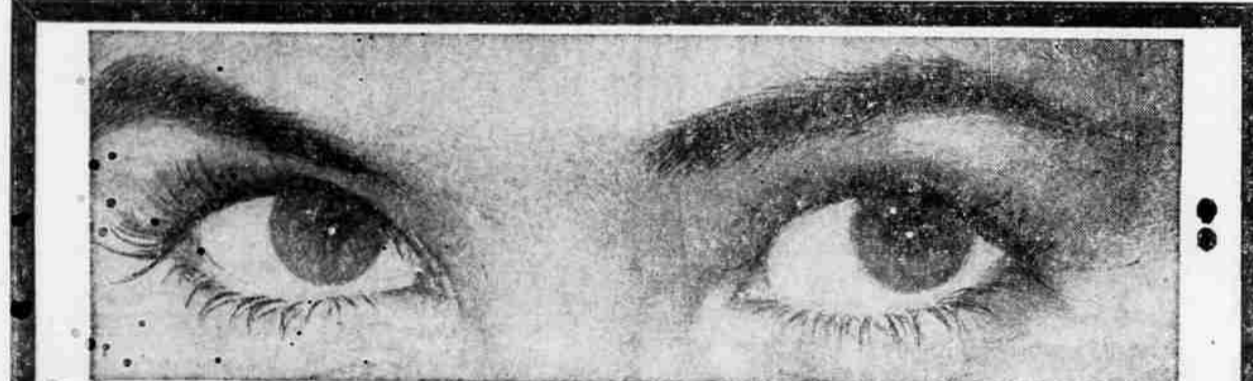
