

## Emergency Raises Approved for State Hospital Doctors

Salem — (UP) — Emergency raises of \$60 a month for doctors employed in state mental and tuberculosis hospitals have been approved by members of the State Board of Control.

An additional \$30 a month was voted to assist superintendents of the institutions which include Oregon State hospital, Fairview home, State Tuberculosis hospital and Eastern Oregon state hospital.

Civil Service Director Charles W. Terry told the board the raises were necessary to retain the present doctor staff and recruit new physicians.

Terry said the salary of Oregon's institutional doctors was comparable with California but below Washington.

Dr. Dean Brooks, superintendent of the State hospital, reported several months ago that he was unable to keep his medical staff together with salaries paid at the time. A study of the doctor's salaries was then ordered by Gov. Elmo Smith.

The Board of Control was expected to conclude its study of institutional budgets here today. It will then formulate a tentative building program for submission to the 1957 Legislature.

Klamath Falls — (UP) — A 33-year-old Mexican railroad section hand, originally charged with raping and stabbing a 15-year old girl here last June, has been sentenced to seven years in Oregon state prison for assault with a dangerous weapon.

Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg imposed sentence after Luis Palizado Garcia waived grand jury hearing and pleaded guilty to the reduced charge.

## Texas Fight Could Control Senate

Austin, Tex. — (UP) — Texas Eisenhower Democrats and liberal-loyalists opened a new fight today, with control of the new U.S. Senate possibly in the balance.

The pro-Eisenhower group was led by Gov. Allan Shivers who demanded that Sen. Price Daniel (D-Tex.) resign from the Senate immediately. Daniel is Texas' governor-elect.

The senator submitted a resignation Sept. 27, to be effective Jan. 15.

The new Senate lineup includes 49 Democrats and 47 Republicans. If Daniel's seat were vacant when the new Senate is organized, a 47-47 tie vote could result, since Sen. Frank Lausche (D-Ohio) has said he will take his seat some days after the new sessions opens.

Vice President Richard M. Nixon would cast the deciding vote in case of a tie. If the Republicans should elect a GOP candidate as Daniel's successor, the new Senate would line up 48-48, with Nixon again breaking the tie.

Shivers released a letter sent to Daniel Monday, saying: "If you do not resign effective immediately, with no strings attached, I must agree with many of your promises to the contrary, you now seek to control both offices—governor of Texas and the United States Senate — and plan to appoint your own successor."
