## CP Jaycees Will Sponsor Voice of Democracy Contest

Central Point — The Central Point Junior Chamber of Commerce will sponsor a Voice of Democracy contest at 8 p.m. Monday, Nov. 19 in the Crater High school cafeteria. Six of the eight students to participate in the contest are Joan Dobrot, junior; Larry Smith, senior; Judy Davis, junior; Phyllis Taylor, junior; David Mack, junior; and Louise Pendleton, junior. The two remaining contestants will be named before Monday. Each of the eight students will speak from three to five minutes on the subject, "I Speak for Democracy." They will explain in their own words "what Democracy means to me." **Students Selected**

Students to participate in the contest chosen from among 54 entrants. The local winner will receive a plaque and the next 12 runner-ups a key. John Smock of the Central Point Junior High will be judging chairman and Jim Glenn will be awards chairman. Don Lacy is chairman for the VOD contest. As a part of a national project 50 Jaycee groups in Oregon will sponsor contests for about 400 high school students. The speech of each school winner will be tape recorded for a district run-off.
