## Phillies Trade Ennis For Repulski, Morgan

Philadelphia — (UP) — The Philadelphia Phillies today traded Del Ennis, their best home run producer of all time, to the St. Louis Cardinals in exchange for slugging outfielder Rip Repulski and utility infielder Bobby Morgan.

Ennis, 31-year-old native Philadelphia who has played the entire 11 years of his Major League career with the Phillies, broke a record set by Chuck Klein in the 1930s when he hit 26 homers last season for a lifetime total of 259. Klein hit 243.

**Drove in 100 Runs**  
Ennis drove in at least 100 runs in four straight seasons prior to 1956, when he batted .307 with a .260 batting average. His best home run out-

put was in 1950, when he led the Phils to their first National League pennant in 35 years with 31 round trippers.

He was estimated to be earning about \$30,000 a year with the Phils, second only to Robin Roberts.

### Promising Slugger

Repulski, at 28, is considered one of the league's most promising right-handed sluggers. A native of Sauk City, Minn., the strapping outfielder hit 277 last season and 270 the year before, banging out 34 home runs in the 1955 season.

Utility infielder Morgan, from Oklahoma City, played with the Phils in 1954, 1955 and part of last season before being traded to St. Louis in May. He broke into the majors with the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1950. His highest Major League batting mark was .262 with the Phils in 135 games during the 1954 season.

## Jim Brown Named As Back-of-Week

New York — (UP) — Four high-scoring stars led by Jimmy (Blockbuster) Brown of Syracuse were named today in the United Press backfield-of-the-week for outstanding performances in college football last week-end.

Selected with jolting Jimmy were sophomore Billy Stacey of Mississippi State and two members of last year's All-America—Paul Hornung of Notre Dame and Jimmy Swink of Texas Christian.

On a point-making basis, Brown was supreme. He slashed Colgate for six touchdowns on gains ranging from six inches to 50 yards and he booted seven conversions for a walloping 43 points. It was the year's most impressive one man show anywhere and earned Jimmy a spot in the week's "four" for the third time this season.

## 3 League Teams Lack Affiliations

Chicago — (UP) — The Waterloo, Iowa, and Quincy, Ill., baseball clubs in the Three-I league were without major league affiliations today, but league President Hal Totter said he expected the loop to continue operation next season with six teams.

Chicago White Sox officials announced Monday at the league's meeting they are withdrawing their franchise from Waterloo and the New York Yankees cancelled a working agreement with Quincy.

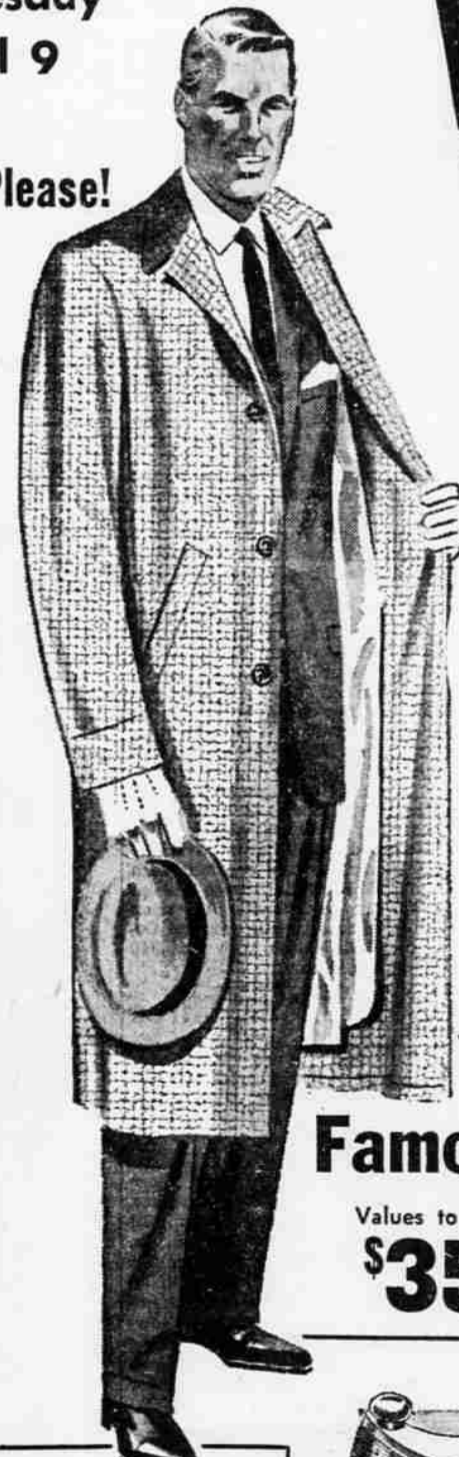
