### Mindszenty's Secretary Held In Budapest Jail

Budapest—U.P.—Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty's secretary was arrested by Communist agents recently while trying to leave Hungary with a message from Mindszenty to Francis Cardinal Spellman of New York, it was learned today.

The secretary, Father Egon Turcsanyi, is now imprisoned in Budapest's Urloe street jail. He was seized 12 days ago as he and a Western correspondent were preparing to flee to Vienna en route to New York. The correspondent was allowed to leave.

#### Charges Not Known

The charges on which Turcsanyi were detained were not known. Neither was the substance of the message which Cardinal Mindszenty, still a refugee in the American legation here, had dispatched to the New York archbishop.

However Father Turcsanyi, besides serving as secretary to the cardinal, is a well known Hungarian authority. It was believed his mission may have concerned the cardinal's plans to write the story of his arrest and eight-year imprisonment by the old Hungarian Communist regime.

### Over 200 Requests Made To Draft Bills

Salem—U.P.—Sam Haley, legislative counsel, said here yesterday that his office has received requests to draft more than 200 bills to be presented to the 1957 session of the Oregon Legislature which convenes in January.

Haley's statement confirmed earlier reports that the legislators would face a huge job in wading through the bills that will be brought up for action in the session.

Most of the requests for drafting of bills have come from legislative interim committees, legislators and state departments.

The large number of bills already in the process of being drawn up drew speculation on how long the legislators would have to remain in session to clean them up.

The 1955 session lasted 115 days, second longest in the state's history.

### Horseshoeing Course Revived by College

Ithaca, N. Y.—U.P.—Cornell University's veterinary college has resumed a course it dropped more than 30 years ago as defunct.

The course, in farriery—horseshoeing—was resumed a couple of years ago by popular demand. The growth of thoroughbred and harness racing created a need for the ancient skill. And the college now trains one man each semester in the craft as part of its extension program.

The course includes study of the anatomy of a horse's foot, hoof trimming, fitting the shoe and forging it. But it takes years to become an expert.

### Klamath Woman Injured in Jump To Elude Policemen

Klamath Falls—U.P.—A 49-year-old Klamath Falls woman was reported to be in good condition at a local hospital today after she jumped from a second story window Tuesday night to escape police.

Officers identified the woman as Mrs. Anna Frisbie. They said they had gone to the rooming house where the woman lived to serve a warrant charging grand theft in Shasta county, California.

The woman's husband told officers his wife was not at home but as they pushed inside the room they found Mrs. Frisbie in the apartment.

She was only partially dressed, officers said, and was granted permission to go to another room to finish dressing.

Minutes later the officers heard screams from outside the rooming house and found the woman had plunged from a second story window in an attempt to elude police.

Doctors said she suffered a compound fracture of one leg and was being held under guard at a Klamath Falls hospital.

### Gas Test Well To Be Sunk Near Ontario

Ontario—U.P.—Jack Sullivan, land manager for the Oroco Oil and Gas Company, announced here yesterday that the firm will start operations next week on sinking a test well about nine miles northwest of here.

Sullivan said the well would be about 6500 feet deep and the company had hopes of striking natural gas, oil or both.

He said the site for the well was determined from studying the results and findings of some 14 other test wells that have been drilled in the area.

#### GONE WITH THE WIND

San Bernardino, Calif.—U.P.—What happened Wednesday to a Marine helicopter pilot, steeped in the corp's "no retreat" tradition, was enough to make him want to join the infantry. While the rotors of Capt. Max Schumacher's helicopter whirred fast enough to drive him forward at 55 miles per hour, the wind near a 10,000-acre brush fire he was spotting drove him that fast backward.

### School Janitor Gets Chance at Teaching

Fred Hoagland, manager of the apartment building, said that a step ladder was leaning against the building only a few feet from the window from which the woman jumped and had she taken time to notice it, would have served her escape.

Worcester, Mass.—U.P.—Worcester School Department is giving one of its janitors a crack at teaching.

Joseph J. Hastings, 44, laid aside his broom and received a three-month leave of absence from the custodian force to try his hand as a substitute teacher. He hopes later to be appointed a regular.

Hastings, a graduate of Holy Cross College, gave up a prior teaching job at Fort Kent, Me., because it was 500 miles from home.

He took an extensive elementary teaching course this summer and passed the national teaching examinations.



