

Mindszenty Described as Tool Of Reactionaries in Hungary

Budapest—(UP)—The official Hungarian government newspaper Sunday charged Josef Cardinal Mindszenty with being a tool of the reactionary elements in Hungary.

It said Mindszenty's own words condemned him as a "spokesman for the counter-revolution, with political aims hidden under his cassock."

The article was distributed in London by the official Soviet Tass news agency.

The attack by the NEP Szabadsag was the most bitter against the cardinal since freedom fighters released him from house arrest in Felsopeteny. He sought and was granted asylum in the U.S. legation here, Nov. 4 and has been there ever since.

The newspaper said the cardinal was a "typical representative of Horthy Fascism" who "wanted to end Socialist construction and the people's power."

It charge he expressed the "aims of the counter-revolution" in a speech Nov. 3, the day before the Russian army attacked Hungary for the second time in 10 days.

"Mindszenty was made cautious as were other politicians

of the bourgeois restoration by the presence of the Soviet army on the outskirts of Budapest and by the news arriving of more Soviet troops entering Hungary," the newspaper said.

Reason for Abstaining
"That was the reason he abstained from entering into such details as . . . the cancellation of land reform and the return of industries to their former owners."

NEP Szabadsag said the "Horthyite leaders of the counter-revolutionary forces wanted to thrust Mindszenty into prominence because he was regarded as a man above parties."

The cardinal's release from house arrest in Felsopeteny was organized and directed by a Maj. Antal Palinkas, "who is no other than the son of one of the prominent figures of the counter-revolution of 1919," it said.

It referred to the overthrow of the Red dictatorship of Bela Kun.

Lawful Calling
The newspaper said Mindszenty "did not omit to threaten all those who it might concern."

"He emphasized that a lawful calling to account of all persons responsible must take place in

all fields. What was this if not a proclamation of a general campaign against the partisans for proletarian power?"

"This could be revealed by all this that Mindszenty was a spokesman for the counter-revolution, with political aims hidden under his cassock."

A Nichol's Worth of . . . Comment On This and That

Washington—(UP)—Most everyone has heard of Paul Bunyan, the mythical giant of the Blue Ox Babe hard North Country, and his Blue Ox Babe.

Between them they managed some colossal stunts. Like the day Paul commanded Babe to take five steps—and a big rain came and there were the Great Lakes.

I never knew until recently that Paul had a brother named Cal Bunyan, who built the biggest railroad in the world. This flight of fancy is contained in an article Budd L. McKillips, penned for "Tracks," a publication of the Chesapeake & Ohio and Nickel Pere Marquette Railroad.

The line was called the I&A&S; Square name Ireland, Jerusalem, Australia and Southern Indiana Railroad. Only reason it didn't put the locals out of business was that it was a non-stop road.

Anti-Bragging
According to a fictitious character named "Springsheels" Conley, Cal Bunyan got worked up over the bragging the Great Northern did over its new line. Better railroads C. B. would build. He finally did, but it took a bit of time.

This was to be a big, big, railroad. Common ballast was out, so Cal fetched in boulders from the Rockies. Each boulder weighed six tons.

The largest steel mill in the country worked night and day (36 hours a day, nine days a week, according to maker-upper McKillips) turning out the rails. And it took a whole tree from the avenue of California giants—the famed Redwoods—to make a single tie.

Gas Explosions Take Three Lives

Gas explosions jarred two communities in Colorado and New Mexico Sunday. Three persons were killed and six others were hospitalized with injuries.

One blast rocked a city block in Springer, a northern New Mexico town of 1,000, killing two persons. Five others were hospitalized with injuries and four were less seriously hurt.

An explosion in a suburban area just southeast of Denver killed a natural gas pipeline worker and injured his co-worker seriously. It occurred when a valve blew off a 24-inch gas line under repair.

Police Chief Virgil Carter said state officials would investigate the Springer explosion, but he was sure it was caused from leakage in an underground butane tank. The explosion erupted into Joe Stewart's "corner" drug store and the Stockman's cafe, and also leveled two nearby unoccupied business buildings.

Then came the building of the engine. McKillips says the Eiffel Tower in Paris was rigged for a drill press. Seems the Tower of Pisa leaned too much.

Coach building was somewhat of a problem, too. Each nail was knocked home by a couple of giants, next of kin to the Bunyans, and they hit down with fence post mauls. At length the train was ready.

But there was a small disturbance when the engine started the air pump for the first run. The first attempt, according to the best information available, "sucked all the air out of four neighboring states." The best authorities are vague about which states were done in.

The I&A&S finally got under way and hasn't been heard from since. Maybe that's fine. A train that could become something of a menace.

Syria Feared As Trouble Source

Washington—(UP)—The United States fears that Syria, using weapons it got from the Communists, may cause a new armed conflict in the Middle East.

Officials doubt that Syria would be successful in such a venture. But they said Russia, which wants to continue stirring up trouble in the Middle East, might goad Syria into starting an incident along its border with Israel that could spread into a larger conflict.

The United States has evidence that Syria has been receiving large amounts of Communist arms for "a considerable period of time."

French sources have estimated that Syria gets about two shiploads of Communist arms a week, but American officials believe this estimate high.

U.S. officials are watching for any signs that Syria might go too far and provoke Israel into a new "preventive action" on the pattern followed against Egypt at the end of October.

Gamblers Scurry From Las Vegas Fire

Las Vegas—(UP)—Las Vegas' great white way was illuminated Sunday night by a fire in the Boulder Club which sent hundreds of patrons scurrying to the street. Damage was estimated at \$200,000.

The fire started in the upper floor of the two-story frame structure built in 1909 and burst through the roof in a spectacular flash of flames and smoke.

Thousands of persons gathered on gaily lighted Fremont st. in downtown Las Vegas as fire fighting units and reserves fought the blaze and kept it from spreading to other buildings in the area.

One man was trapped briefly by the flames before making his escape and a fireman suffered minor injuries when knocked down by a backdraft from the fire.

Club officials carried more than \$190,000 in silver dollars from the premises.
