

### Six Months of Active Duty Part of Reserve Program

One of the first of the local Army Reservists to attend the new Army Reserve six-month active duty program is Pvt. Garie Byington of 1170 Oak st., Ashland. Pvt. Byington, son of Mr. and Mrs. Loren Byington, is a member of the Army Reserve's 417th Engineer Aviation Brigade.

Byington began his six-month training period at Ft. Ord Mar. 11, 1958. After processing, he was assigned to a training regiment composed of six-month reservists.

During the first eight weeks training consisted of basic military subjects such as military justice, weapons, familiarization, field fortifications and close order drill. Basic infantry training is taken by all soldiers, regardless of branch of service. In Byington's case, a two-

week leave followed basic training. However, the leave does not always follow basic training, but may be granted later during the six months.

After basic training, reservists begin eight weeks of specialist training. In Byington's case, he was assigned to a regular Engineer battalion stationed at Fort Ord. For reservists whose military job calls for technical training which is not available at Ft. Ord, they were sent to the nearest Army post offering the training. Byington received his training as a rod and tapeman for a survey party.

Following the eight weeks specialist training, reservists are assigned to a unit of their branch for the remainder of the six months and continue to learn through training. Following the six months ac-

tive duty each reservist is released and returns to his Reserve unit and continues toward the fulfillment of his military obligation.

Under the Reserve plan a young man may choose his branch of service, when he will go on active duty, when he can go to college, find a permanent job, marry, and settle down.

Early in January, 1957, Larry G. Hammond, a 1956 graduate of Medford High school and son of Mr. and Mrs. Ted Hammond will start his six months active duty.

Pvt. Hammond joined the 417th Engineer Aviation Brigade in October and will go to Ft. Ord. After his return next July, Hammond will rejoin the local Reserve unit and participate in weekly drills and annual summer field training.

Thus far, Hammond is the only Medford Reservist scheduled to attend the January school at Ft. Ord from the 417th.

The 417th Engineer Aviation Brigade, commanded by Col. William Prentice, meets each Monday night at 8 p.m. at the federal building in Medford. Interested young men between 17 and 26 are invited to attend and get more information concerning their military obligation.

### Twin Passes First Hurdle for Surgery

Boston — (UP) — Blood tests verifying that Jimmy Foster of Mink Creek, Ida., is an identical twin have put the 13-year-old boy over the first hurdle for a life saving kidney transplant operation.

The tests established the major prerequisite for what may be history's fourth such operation.

Doctors now may decide to replace Jimmy's diseased kidney with a healthy one from his brother, Jerry. Jimmy suffers from a usually fatal kidney ailment, nephritis.

A spokesman at Peter Bent Brigham hospital said, however, the twins must undergo further tests before the specialists will go ahead with the operation.

If performed, the operation would be the first of its kind on children. Three previous transplants were performed on adults.

### Desegregation by Law Said Bound to Succeed

Washington — (UP) — A southern editor and educator predicted Monday that desegregation by law "is bound to succeed."

Editor Harry S. Ashmore of The Arkansas Gazette of Little Rock told the 43rd annual meeting of the Anti-defamation League of B'nai B'rith, Jewish service organization:

"Powerful forces are working to preserve segregation, but in every significant test for the last 20 years the forces working against segregation have proved stronger."

Ashmore said the breakdown of racial segregation in the South is coupled with the changing economic pattern. He said southern leaders "working to industrialize the region are undermining the system of segregation many of them so passionately defend."
