Eastern Third Of Nation Chilled

The eastern third of the nation shivered in a cold wave which was expected to penetrate northern Florida today and threaten vegetable crops.

Meanwhile, farmers in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas were perturbed for the first freeze of the season which weathermen had predicted for early today. Widespread damage was anticipated for winter garden tomato and pepper crops if the freezing temperatures struck.

Heavy snowfalls also were reported along the eastern shores of Lakes Erie and Ontario. Meanwhile, comparatively mild air was pushing in from the west behind the cold front. The warming trend from the Pacific extended from the western Great Lakes through the Dakotas and southward through westward Texas and New Mexico.

Central Point Man Injured in Crash

Wayne T. England, 23, route 2, box 207N, Central Point, suffered slight injuries about 6 a.m. this morning when the car he was operating was involved in an accident on Highway 99 between Medford and Central Point, according to state police.

England was taken to Rogue Valley hospital and later was released. He was injured when he overtook a car on the highway in front of him operated by Lloyd Chester Johnson, 39, 109 Elk st., Medford, and struck it in the rear officers reported. The collision disabled England's car in the highway where he was struck by an unidentified truck and trailer, state police said.

The England car was ignited in the crash, according to state police, and was destroyed. The fire was extinguished by Central Point Rural Fire department. No other injuries were reported.

England was cited for violation of the basic rule, officers said.

Oils, Steels Pace Advance in Market

New York (U.P.)—Stocks surged forward today in an advance that added \$1 billion to stock valuations. Oils and steels paced the advance, which restored half the losses of the four previous sessions.

The key factor behind the market's strength was the government's decision to put into operation its emergency program for western Europe. The oil stocks responded by running up as much as five points.
