

Truman, Stevenson Among Democrats on Advisory Committee

Washington—(AP)—Twenty top Democrats, including former President Truman and Adlai E. Stevenson, were named yesterday to an advisory committee to help chart the Democratic program during the next four years.

The committee was appointed by Chairman Paul Butler of the Democratic National Committee under terms of a resolution adopted last month by the committee's executive group.

The 20 include Democratic leaders of the House and Senate, five "at large" members, and five members to represent Democratic governors and mayors.

In addition to Mr. Truman and Mr. Stevenson, the defeated 1932 and 1936 presidential nominees who announced Tuesday he would not run again, the at-large members include Sen. Estes Kefauver of

Tennessee, this year's vice presidential candidate; Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, widow of the late President, and former Gov. John S. Battle of Virginia.

Congressional members of the committee include Speaker Sam Rayburn; Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson; House Democratic Leader John W. McCormack; and Rep. Edith Green of Oregon.

Other members appointed by Butler included Gov. Averell Harriman of New York, Gov. G. Mennen Williams of Michigan, and Gov. Ernest W. McFarland of Arizona.

Stevenson removed himself from future presidential consideration in a one-page statement issued Tuesday night.

11 Cases of Shipping Disease In County

Salem—Jackson, Multnomah and Josephine counties reported 11 out of the almost 500 cases of hemorrhagic septicemia, most prevalent of animal diseases in Oregon during October, according to the state department of agriculture.

Breakdown on hemorrhagic septicemia cases showed nine in Multnomah county, 11 in Jackson county, two of which were fatal, and one in Josephine county.

The disease, known as shipping disease, was the second greatest killer of Oregon livestock during October. The department explained that heavy weather and cold weather accounted for the unusually large volume of shipping fever cases.

Heat Gives Flowers Incentive To Growth

Madison, Wis.—(AP)—Nobody around here will ever tell Stan Bokelmann he doesn't have a "green thumb."

Cannas and dahlias are among the flowers that grow from bulbs instead of seeds. They are extremely sensitive to cold weather and have to be dug up in the fall and replanted in the spring to keep them from freezing and dying.

Bokelmann didn't dig up his bulbs last fall and didn't expect any cannas or dahlias this year, but the heat from his outside chimney was enough to keep the flowers warm. So the cannas came up five feet high and the dahlias four feet.
