

Teen-Age Freedoms Discussed

Central Point — "Freedom for Teen-agers" was the subject of a panel discussion at a recent meeting of Crater High School Parent-Teacher Association. Gus Koellner, for the parents, indicated that it is the duty of the home to teach young people that freedom has its responsibilities as well as its privileges, and if the teaching has been right, parents can trust their teenagers to use the family car and to follow certain rules of good behavior.

Mrs. Kay Crowell, Jackson County juvenile officer, stated that the youth referred to her department had freedom without knowledge of, or instruction in, how to use that freedom, and so misused it. That parents should be willing to make sacrifices if necessary in order that their sons and daughters might have the use of the family car, was the thought expressed by Dr. Norman K. Tully, Presbyterian minister at Central Point and Jacksonville. He asked that love and courteous consideration by both generations are essentials in family understanding.

In the opinion of the student members of the panel, Miss Virginia Walters and Dan Nolte, freedom is a privilege, not to be taken lightly, and while teenagers in trouble receive much publicity, they are in the minority. Representing the teachers, William MacFarlane stated that young people like an ordered, disciplined life, and need a firm hand on the reins. If they know exactly what is expected of them, there is less chance that they will take advantage of the freedom given, he said.

Mrs. Arnold Bohner was the moderator.

Continuing the series on the departments of Crater High School, a science demonstration was presented by Marilyn Cordy, Stanley Green and Jon Frederick, students of Clarence Miller's third period class.

Following the invocation by Dr. Tully, Mrs. C. B. Cordy, president, called for a budget report for 1956-57, which was adopted. The welfare committee chairman, Mrs. Walter Carr, requested clothing for a Central Point family whose home recently burned down. Membership chairman, Mrs. Chester Ashton, reported 236 members. Refreshments were served by mothers of freshmen.

There will be no meeting during December. On the fourth Monday in January, the legislative committee will present State Senator Phillip Lowry as the speaker.

To Hold Dinner

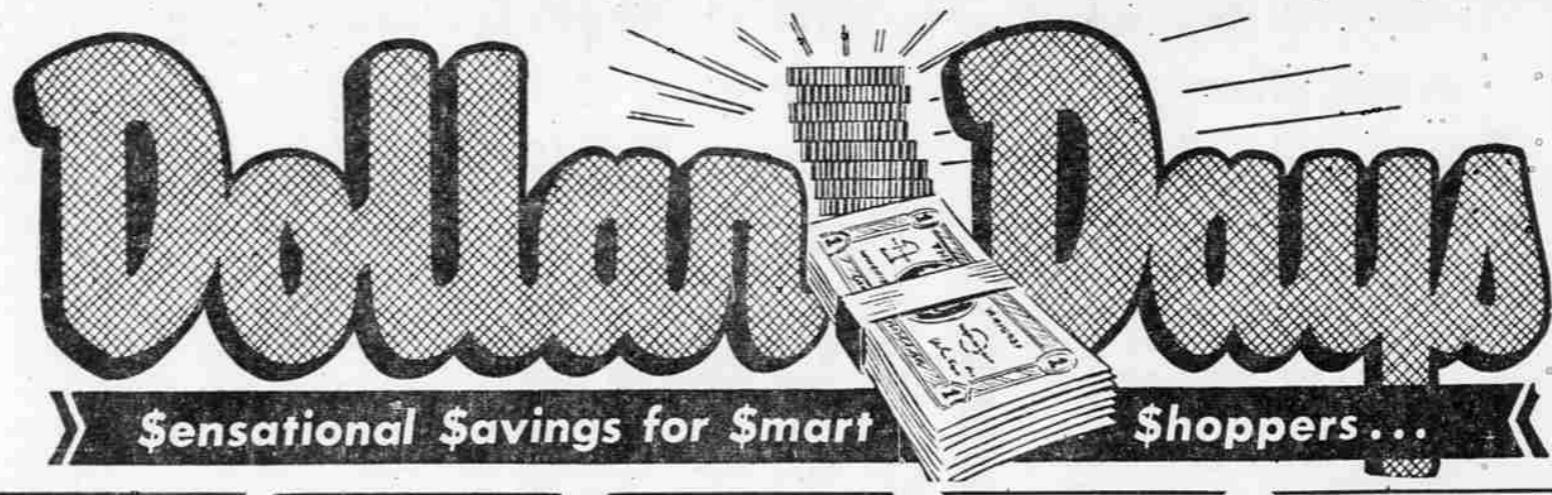
