San Diego Police Question Vagrant In Chicago Deaths

San Diego — (AP) — Police today questioned a 30-year-old vagrant in connection with the unsolved strangulation murders of three young boys near Chicago last year.

Richard Fred Ebert was picked up yesterday. Officers said he became a suspect in the murders when he kept saying "that time I was in the woods" during routine questioning.

Detectives said Ebert told them "the three boys in the woods... it was terrible the way they were killed." Ebert, when asked if he killed the boys said, "I don't know," police said.

The bodies the Robert Peterson, 14, John Schuessler, 13, and his brother, Anton Jr., 11, were found Oct. 18, 1955, in the Robinson preserve woods less than 10 miles west of Chicago.

Suffers "Blackout Spells"

Ebert told officers here he suffered "blackout spells." He said he had been confined in mental institutions at Camarillo, Calif., and Elgin, Ill. Ebert claimed he was employed as a sheet metal worker at Aurora, Ill., at the time of the slayings.

Chicago authorities revealed following the slayings that bits of an infrequently used heat resistant stainless steel were found under the fingernails of the Peterson boy. They also said bits of special earth used in making an insecticide along with bits of bone meal used in fertilizer were found embedded in wounds in the scalp of the boy.

Chicago pathologists said the wounds were made by a short-handled garden rake.

Idaho Power's Bid Said Slap at Voters

Salem — (AP) — Opponents of Idaho Power company's three-dam development of the Snake river presented a brief before the Oregon Hydroelectric commission yesterday labeling the company's project an attempt to reverse a vote of the people of Oregon.

Portland Attorney Don S. Willner filed the brief in answer to the utility company's request that the commission exempt its proposed dams from some provisions of the Oregon hydroelectric act.

Willner filed the brief in his capacity as representative of groups opposing the low-dam construction. Organizations represented by Willner include the Oregon State Grange, Oregon State Labor Council, Oregon Farmers Union, Oregon REA Cooperative Association and Hells Canyon Development Association.

Idaho Power has asked the commission to waive the provisions that would give the state the right to take over the dams 50 years after they are built and to specify the rate at which the projects will be depreciated.

Willner's brief stated that the provisions were contained in a Senate bill of 1948 which was referred to the voters and defeated.

Telephone Rate Testimony Heard

Salem — (AP) — A hearing on rate increases for Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company amounting to about five per cent was held before the State Public Utilities Commission here yesterday.

The company seeks increases in rates amounting to \$3,220,000 annually to help finance a \$100 million construction program.

Testimony was limited to a clarification to its request by the company.

Frank Dressler, vice president and general manager of the company said that some of the proposed toll increases would amount to slightly more than seven per cent, but that the average increase sought was closer to five per cent.

The commission set another hearing in Salem for Dec. 17 to hear cross examination of the company and any protest testimony.

Hearing Waived in Child Beating Case

Portland — (AP) — Glen Denness, 34-year-old Portland longshoreman accused of beating his 13-year-old daughter, waived preliminary hearing on a charge of contributing to the girl's delinquency here yesterday and was bound over to the grand jury on the charge.

The girl and her father came face to face in the courtroom yesterday for the first time since she fled to a neighbor's home last week, accusing her father of beating her.

Ball on the contributing charge was fixed at \$1,500 and Denise pleads to have it reduced. The father also is under \$3,000 bail on the beating charge.

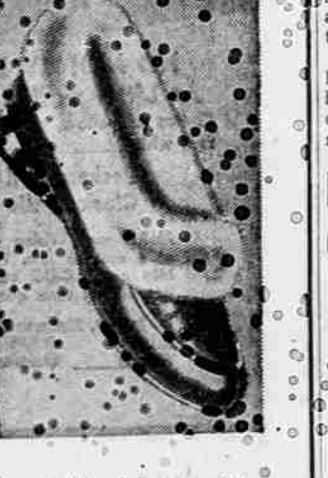
