New York — (U.P.)—Stocks rose to new highs for more than a month in moderate trading today.

Railroads again led the major sections with the utilities a close second in percentage rise. Industrials were firm, too, with steels, oils, shipbuilding issues and electronics stocks strong.

Best gainers were Royal Dutch in the oils, Great Northern in the papers, Texas and Pacific in the rails, and Youngstown Sheet & Tube in the steels. These were up two or better. Youngstown at its top set a new high at 127 1/2, up 4 1/2 points.

# 150 Permits Issued For Tree Cutting

Cave Junction — More than 150 Christmas tree cutting permits, covering 14,000 acres, have been issued to Illinois valley tree cutters so far this year, according to State Forest Patrol Warden John Moe.

At the conservative estimate of 10 trees to an acre, this would mean 140,000 trees are spoken for by residents. Roadside prices for Christmas trees Moe said are from 50 cents to \$1, while stumpage starts a 25 cents per tree.

Barring unforeseen losses, Valley woodlot owners will earn an aggregate of about \$50,000 this year.

Largest permit was issued Raymond Frost of Selma for 2,000 acres of his land. R. J. McCracker of Cave Junction received a permit covering 760 acres, also on the Frost property.
