Duke Offers Estate To Nudists

London—(U.P.)—Tourists looked forward today to a promise of better entertainment and attractions at the home of the Duke of Bedford, who has offered his estate as the site for a nudist convention.

The duke, who throws open his Windsor Abbey estate near Bedford to tourists every Sunday at 35 cents a head, said in a letter to the Sunday Pictorial he would welcome the World Congress of Nudists.

"I understand the world Congress of Nudists is meeting in Britain in 1938 and is looking for a suitable site," he wrote. "It occurs to me that Windsor might provide the necessary facilities."

The duke said he would "organize what ever the require in the way of privacy for the convention."

"But I can promise you that we shall not raise our general admission fee for the public while the nudists are here," he added. "Our policy is better entertainment and attractions for our visitors each year."
