

Idaho Vandal Hoop Coach Optimistic

(This is another of a series on the prospects of West Coast basketball teams for the 1958-59 season.)

 Moscow, Ida. (UP)—Idaho's Vandals, bowling along with three straight victories in the early season going, had Coach Harlan Hodges in a pleasant frame of mind today and for good reason.
 "We'll win some games we're not supposed to win," he said. "Our juniors have a year's experience behind them now and the bench strength looks good with players up from the first team. I mean I've seen since I coached here."

The Vandals just beat out Washington State last season for last place in the Pacific Coast Conference race but this year they might wind up as a relentless band of spoilers. Hodges only has lost two seniors from that quintet.

One of the hottest operators now is sophomore guard Gary Sigmon who popped in 22 points last Saturday while the Vandals were defeating Montana. Another of the team's best players appears to be sophomore Wahlen Coleman, a 6-2 guard from Owensboro, Ky.

"The best defense is to score more points than the offense," Hodges has theorized more than once.

There are plenty of other men around to help bear this load, including veteran forwards Brent Thompson, 6-2, Mark Cole, 6-3, and six-foot guards Gary Sather and Bill Wilson, two other sophomores.

Among the leading prospects are Harold Dequano, 6-4 forward; guard J.P. Staffer, 6-2 and guard Lou Wesley.

The team is loaded with second year men but they are up from a freshman team that only lost three games.

The Pilots, whacking Oregon with a 79-46 setback Friday night followed up by dumping Oregon State, 56-55 here Saturday night. The win was the third in as many starts for the Pilots.

Oregon bounced back from its Friday night drubbing by the Pilots to outrun and out rebound a much taller University of Texas outfit and post a 65-64 upset.

The Portland win over Oregon State was a thriller. The Pilots had to overcome an 11 point deficit in the second half wrapped up the decision when Wally Panel, Portland sophomore, stole the ball with 26 seconds left on the clock and stalled out their one point advantage.

Bill Dellinger Arrives Home

Springfield, Ore. (UP)—Bill Dellinger, distance runner from the University of Oregon and recent entry for the United States in the Olympic games at Melbourne, Australia, returned to his home here over the week end.

The 22-year-old Oregon runner will report to the air wing of the ROTC at the university in a few days for duty. He probably will remain on the campus with the unit until early next year, when he will report for flight training and three years of service.

Dellinger said he believed he learned a great deal from watching in the world's top distance runners in action during the Olympics and expressed the hope that he can continue with his running during his time in the service. Also on his mind already was a shot at making the 1960 Olympic squad.

Mick's Toga Confirmed

Chicago (UP)—Statistical evidence of Mickey Mantle's one-man wrecking crew job on American league pitchers was provided today.

The official figures, released by the AL, and compiled by the young New York Yankee slugger as the first triple crown winner in the circuit in 10 years. In addition, they showed that Mickey led the league's sluggers in no fewer than five departments.

Mantle won the triple crown by taking the batting championship with a .333 figure, leading in homers with 52 and driving in 130 runs for the top mark in that department. Mantle is the first American leaguer to win the triple crown since 1947 when Ted Williams of the Boston Red Sox hit .342, cracked 32 homers and drove in 114 runs.

Mantle also led the circuit this year in runs scored, with 132, and in total bases, with 376.
