## Florida Negro Denies Directing Remarks At School Teacher

Bushnell, Fla.—(UPI)—A Negro farmhand has denied yelling "Hello, baby" at an attractive white schoolteacher before he was allegedly flogged and abducted by seven white men.

Jesse Woods, 39, testifying during the trial of the seven men, said Monday he did not make the remark to the teacher, Mary Evelyn Hill, nor to any other white woman Oct. 28, the day of his abduction.

The dark-haired teacher, wearing a tight-fitting suit, appeared in the courtroom Monday, but did not testify during the opening session of the trial.

The seven central Florida men are facing charges of false imprisonment and aggravated assault. They are accused of abducting Woods from a jail cell, where he had gone for protection, and assaulting him.

Woods had returned to jail following arraignment on drunkenness and disorderly charges after noticing that he and his father were being followed by several cars on their way home. His father had put up his bail. Shortly after being accommodated by police, Woods said, "two boys shined a light in the jail and said, 'There he is.'"

"I lay down under a cot in another cell . . . they came into the jail and hit me on the nose and face," he testified.

His assailants, Woods said, carried him into a car, drove off and then abandoned him.

"I didn't see anybody well enough to recognize them," Woods told the court.

After he was abandoned, Woods disappeared and was feared dead. FBI officials found him staying with a blind Negro preacher in Andalusia, Ala.

Portland — (UPI) — The State Board of Higher Education, at its meeting here yesterday, gave a tentative look at a 12-month class year at state schools but was told that the plan has "definite liabilities."

Langley Amends Civil Rights Suit

Portland — (UPI) — District Attorney William Langley of Multnomah county yesterday filed an amended complaint in Federal Court in which he seeks \$2 million for deprivation of his civil rights.

Langley last July brought suit against Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton, James B. Elkins and the Oregonian seeking \$1 million in compensatory and punitive damages.

His amended complaint also names Secretary of State Earl T. Newberry; Police Chief Jim Purcell Jr.; Michael J. Frey, publisher of the Oregonian, and Robert C. Notson, William Morris, Herbert Lundy, William Lambert and Wallace Turner, the latter five all employees of the Oregonian.

Langley, who was indicted by a grand jury here last summer, said he believed the parties named in his suit acted together to deprive him of his civil rights by the use of illegal telephone and room-conversation recordings and illegal use of the Oregon Voters Pamphlet and other acts.

Langley was indicted for malfeasance in office and with conspiring to open Portland to gambling.
