Mrs. F. M.—I would like to know what to do to regain my husband's love. It's not that he is unfaithful to me. He's just indifferent.

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Irish Counties Gird Against Rebel Army

Belfast, Northern Ireland — (U.P.)—The six Irish counties loyal to Britain girded today against a "war of liberation" waged by the outlawed Irish Republican Army.

Steel-helmeted police and auxiliaries armed with sten guns patrolled the border between northern Ireland and the Irish republic and kept an eye on all major roads.

About 100 men attacked British installations, bridges and police patrols in 11 widely-scattered areas in northern Ireland Wednesday. Two men were wounded by gunfire and damage was estimated at \$140,000.
