"They arouse the emotions and provide a good background for a proposal," Mrs. Bell explained.

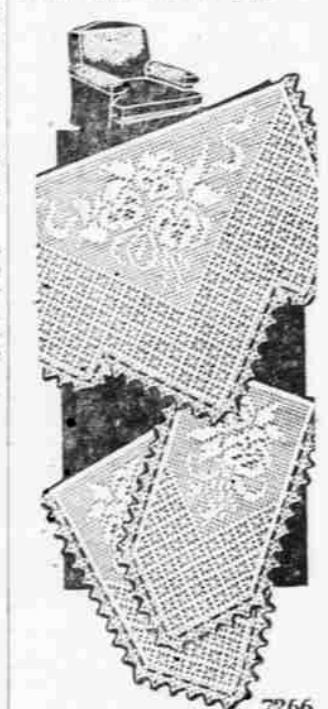
Blue and green, on the other hand, are perfect aides to the career girl who wants to stay that way, she said.

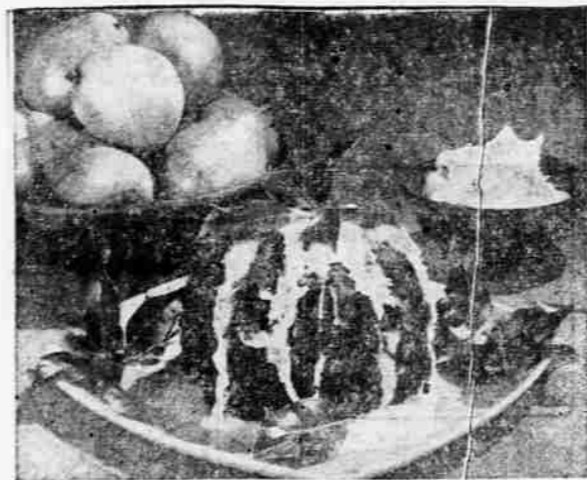

Those who favor traditional holiday dinners are sure to want a steamed pudding dessert, yet many want something less rich than the suet-base favorites. Fresh pears team with bright cranberries to make just such a delightful pudding. Juicy, mellow fresh pears are a sweet contrast to the cranberries and make a moist, delicate texture and flavor. Thus with just a hint of refreshing tartness it is a little different from other puddings.

For steamed pear cranberry pudding use 1 cup diced Bosc, Anjou or Comice pears, 1 cup halved cranberries, 1 1/2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons soda, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup molasses and 1/2 cup hot water.

Wash and core pears and dice. Sort and halve cranberries and add to pears. Sift together flour, soda and salt. Add fruit and mix well. Combine hot water with molasses and stir into fruit mixture. Pour into greased mold, cover and steam for 2 hours. Fill mold about 2/3 full to allow for expansion during cooking. Serve with favorite pudding sauce. Serves 6.

**Clothing Fires Preventable Says Underwriters' League**

New York — Most frequent victims of clothing fires are children and elderly people, says the underwriters' league.

Children's clothing catches fire when they are playing with matches, playing around stoves or heaters, and too close to outdoor fires. Elderly people's clothing catches fire when they use stoves carelessly, warm themselves at fireplaces and radiant heaters, or fall asleep while smoking.

Some clothes, because of the way the cloth is made or because of the style of the garment, are more dangerous than others.

Therefore, beware of light weight, loosely fitting clothes, ruffles, flounces, kimona type sleeves, filmy nets and gauze. Also beware of sweaters with brushed long fibres for some ignite easily and burn intensely. **Wearers Careless**

**OMPA President Answers Criticism**

Portland — Richard Westberg, Ashland, president of the Oregon Milk Producers association, last week blamed comparatively low OMPA membership in the Portland area for failure to obtain higher prices for milk producers.

Westberg and Lester Adams, Applegate, manager of the association, were targets of criticism Wednesday at a meeting in Portland of nearly 90 dairymen who want higher prices. Suggested at the meeting for solution of the low price problem were two pieces of legislation and a campaign to oust Westberg and Adams.

One of the proposed legislative acts would be aimed at preventing milk or ice cream dealers from furnishing equipment, loans, discounts or rebates to obtain wholesale accounts. The other would provide for a usage audit by all milk distributors.

Westberg said success in negotiations to raise producers' prices is proportional to the percentage of producers represented. He said upstate, where progress has been good, about 95 per cent of the producers are OMPA members, while in the Portland area, membership is only about 50 per cent.

**Police Use Puppets For Traffic Program**

Puppets and policemen are combining talents in Germany in order to educate the traffic accident toll, according to the German Tourist Information Office.

In the heavily motorized state of Northrhine-Westphalia, some police officers are being taught how to manipulate puppets for specially-written plays before schoolchildren. The policemen and their puppets will demonstrate the dangers of the ever-increasing road traffic and show how to avoid these perils.

acid are thoroughly dissolved, dip the material or clothing you wish to flameproof. Then wring it out and hang it up to dry.

This method can be used on any washable fabric. Moreover, the material can be ironed without affecting the flameproofing. It will remain flameproof until washed.

Fabrics so treated will retain their flexibility and softness. However, the flame-retardant qualities are lost when the fabric is washed again, and the process must be repeated after each washing.

When clothes catch fire—don't run. Throw the victim to the floor and roll her in a rug, a blanket or a coat.

Wrap the rug or blanket around the neck first, to keep the poisonous gases of combustion away from the face.

If no rug, blanket or coat is available, roll the victim over and over on the floor to smother the flames.

Running only fans the flames. Since all fire gases rise, a victim in an upright position tends to inhale the toxic gases.

If your fur coat gets wet in rain or snow, wipe it off with a turkish towel and shake gently to bring back the fluff to the fur. A fur coat dries best at room temperature; never near a radiator or hot air register.

If you want to cut the amount of wax used in household chores, first dampen the waxing cloth, wring it dry, and then pick up the wax. You'll find this keeps the wax from being absorbed into the fibers of the cloth.
