Washington—Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, on concluding his private talks with President Eisenhower: "I think India and America will get along very well in the future in international affairs."
Vienna—Vice President Richard M. Nixon on the growing influx of Hungarian refugees: "We recognize that much remains to be done and we are fully determined to do our full share in meeting the needs which have grown out of the refugee problem."
Bern, Switzerland—Swiss government officials, on confirming mobilization last week of "destruction detachments" to guard the eastern frontier: "To say that we fear a Soviet attack is nonsense. Who would ever dream of climbing over the Alps with tanks."
Dallas—U.S. District Court Judge William H. Atwell, in refusing to desegregate the white schools of Dallas immediately: "If there is such a thing as civil rights, there are civil wrongs. It would be unthinkable and unbearably wrong to make white students get out of Dallas schools so as to let in colored students."
Chicago—Erwin Staab, a 32-year-old machinist, after "confessing" and then denying taking part in the slaying of three schoolboys 14 months ago: "Every time I get drunk, and that's often, I brood about the case and get an urge to confess it."
