

Man Suffers Injuries In Fight at Tavern

J. B. Myers, 42, suffered forehead lacerations about 12:45 p.m. Sunday following a fight at the Fourth Street tavern, according to Medford police.

Myers was taken to Rogue Valley hospital by Medford ambulance service. Hospital attendants said his wounds were not serious. He was released the same night.

Myers charged William Lester Hurst, 115 West 10th st., Medford, with striking him with a bottle causing the wounds, police said. Hurst was arrested on charges of disorderly conduct, officers reported, and will appear in police court 8 a.m.

Irvin, charged with disorderly conduct, was fined \$50 and given a 30-day suspended sentence. Waldron and Farrell, charged with assault and battery, were fined \$50 and also received 30-day terms in city jail.
