Skin Eruptions Due to Drugs... In a recent article, Drs. V. M. Henington, C. B. Kennedy, and O. P. Williams of New Orleans said that skin diseases due to a person's occupation constitute two-thirds of all industrial diseases...

Common among the sensitizing chemicals is chromium, which is used for putting a shiny plating on many metals. It can produce punched-out skin ulcers with raised hard borders.

Many of the workers in rubber plants also get into trouble because of irritating substances which are incorporated in the rubber. Some of the men develop patches of white skin, and some get skin ulcers and eruptions.

Workers in the shoe industry get skin trouble because of substances used in the preparing of leather. Some wearers of shoes get eruptions on the skin of their feet due to chemicals used in making either the leather or the shoes.

Machinists often get into trouble because of chlorinated hydrocarbons in the "cutting oils" used with machine tools. To avoid contact with chemicals, many factory workers now use impervious aprons and sleeves.
