

# Medford Bounces Cleveland 60-43 in Pre-League Wrap-up

Black Tornado hoopmen of Medford high wound up pre-league warm-up competition Friday with their second triumph over a Portland school and turned the full and heavy concentration to defense of the District A-1 and Southern Oregon championships they have claimed for two successive seasons.

A 60 to 43 decision over Cleveland of the Portland Inter-scholastic circuit Friday was the fourth straight victory of the season for the Tornado which will enter conference contention with a 4-2 time-up record.

In whipping the Indians the Medford couple courtiers joined with Grants Pass in making the second night of a two-team net-roving invasion a bleak one in the fog-shrouded Rogue river valley. Grants Pass signalled its determination for a strong bid in the Southern Oregon loop by a 30 to 36 win over the Franklin Quakers and tall Blaine Jensen. The victory was surprisingly impressive, coming on the heels of a 54 to 44 setback at the hands of Cleveland on Thursday.

Medford downed Franklin 50 to 46 in Thursday play.

**Klamath Beaten**

The SO conference, however, didn't make a full sweep of its Friday play with the P.L. Jefferson handed Klamath Falls its first loss of the season, 63 to 59.

Another SO member, Ashland, was a Friday winner nosing 30 to 29 the Cottage Grove club which had downed Crater, 45 to 39 on Thursday.

The Black Tornado's opening loop rivalry puts it against Crater next Friday and Saturday while Ashland and Grants Pass contend.

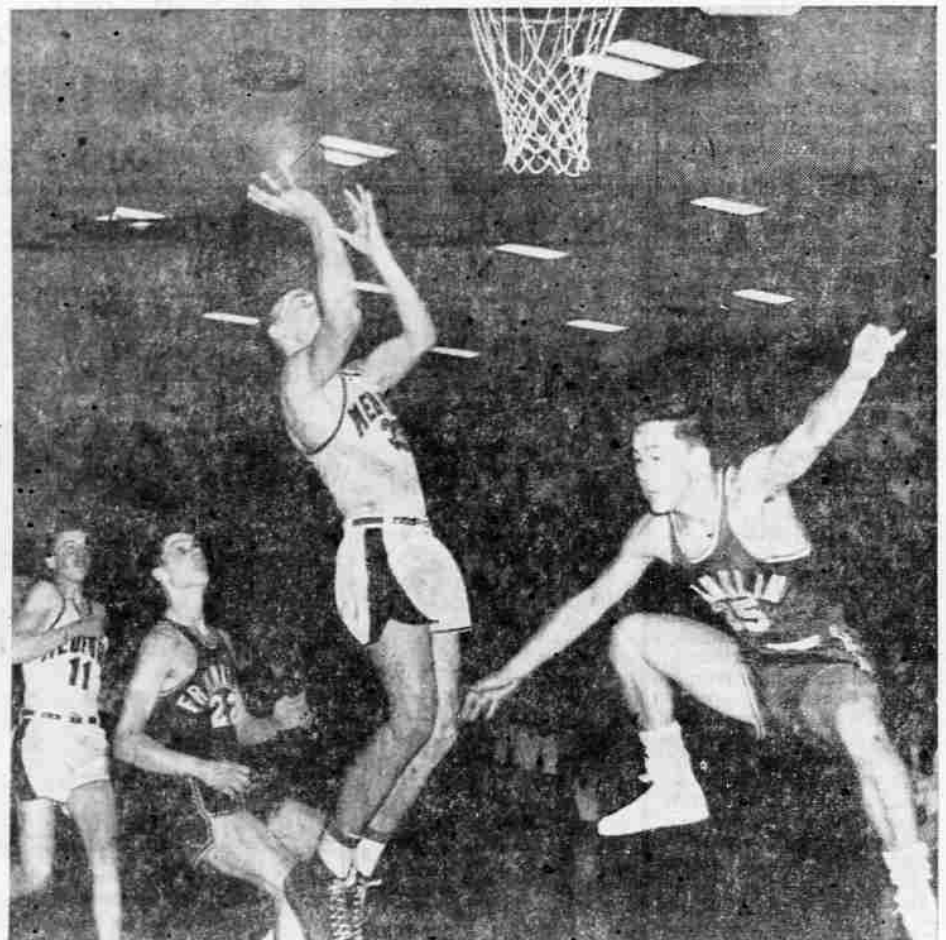
