Social Security Taxes Go Up for 55 Million Workers

Washington (UPI)—Social Security taxes are going up Tuesday for more than 55 million job-holders, and about five million employers. At the same time, the armed forces will begin deducting social security taxes for the first time from the pay of 2.8 million servicemen. Congress earlier this year in separate actions:

- 1. Raised payroll taxes, effective Jan. 1, to finance the new disability insurance benefit which, it added to the social security program. About nine out of 10 of the country's 65.3 million jobs are covered by social security and will be hit by the tax boost.
2. Brought servicemen permanently into the social security program as part of a program of providing broader military survivor and retirement benefits.
Government Collects
Starting Tuesday, the government will begin collecting from workers 2 1/2 per cent of the first \$4,200 of annual earnings, or a maximum of \$94.50 a year.
The present rate is 2 per cent, or a maximum of \$84. Employees who must match contributions of their employees, will also have to pay the higher rate.
An estimated 7 million self-employed persons covered by the program will pay 33 1/2 per cent, or a maximum of \$157.50 annually. They now pay 3 per cent, or a maximum of \$126.
The higher tax will cause a reduction in take home pay of almost 50 million employees as soon as they receive their first paycheck for January work. Military personnel will be hit at the same time.
Employers who pay quarterly won't feel the higher tax until April. Self-employed persons who pay annually won't feel it until they file their income tax return for 1957 in April, 1958.

Saarlanders Stage Parades; Celebrate Return to Germany

Saarbruecken, Sarrr.—(UPI)— Jubilant Saarlanders staged village parades today to celebrate their return to the West German republic after 11 1/2 years of French control. The tiny territory, caught for 40 years in a tug-of-war between Germany and France, returned to West Germany at one minute after midnight. But already some of the 970,000 Saarlanders were jumping the gun to greet the occasion. They began their New Year's Eve celebration this morning and planned to carry it right up until midnight.
Calm Transfer
The calm transfer of the 900, square-mile coal and steel area will be in sharp contrast to the stormy days of 1935 when Adolf Hitler grabbed the Saar after a plebiscite in which a 90 per cent vote was cast for reunion with Germany.
The new treaty whereby France agreed to give up the Saar was signed on Oct. 27. It removed a major source of trouble between the two neighboring nations. The 970,000 inhabitants of the Saar are almost unanimously German-speaking and their ties are with Germany.
It will become the tenth state of the German federal republic and will be represented in both houses of the Bonn Parliament. It will vote in the forthcoming national elections in September.
Duty Free
But until Jan. 1, 1960, the territory still will use French money and will have the strange situation of French customs officers inspecting and taxing German goods moving into one of its own states. French goods will come in duty free. However, the Saar postal and railroad services will be taken over by West Germany.
In three years the territory will transfer to a German economy.

Two Irish Groups Outlawed by Act

Belfast, Northern Ireland (UPI)—Northern Ireland Saturday outlawed two Irish nationalist organizations—Sinn Fein (Our selves Alone) and Finna Uladh (Warriors of Ulster)—under its Special Powers Act.
Both organizations allegedly support the outlawed Irish Republican Army, which has raided Northern Ireland installations with guns and bombs in recent weeks.
Northern Ireland police raided Sinn Fein headquarters here Friday night, and seized documents and records. Members of both organizations now are liable to imprisonment.
Finna Uladh is the political wing of Faor Uladh Free Ulster. Both organizations are committed to fight for union of Northern Ireland with the Republic of Ireland to the south.

Hitler Officially Listed as Dead

Berlin (UPI)—Adolf Hitler was listed as officially dead Saturday.
Cases No. 29049 and 29050 were the last recorded for 1956 in the records of West Germany's central registrar's office. No. 29049 was Eva Braun, Hitler's mistress and wife of a few hours. No. 29050 was Hitler.
The case had dragged on for nearly 12 years because neither body ever was found. Survivors of the last days of the third reich testified that the two bodies were burned after Hitler and Eva killed themselves in the bunker of the reichschancellery as Russian troops closed in around Berlin.

Gas Price War Ends In Eugene Area

Eugene (UPI)—A gas price war here that made motorists happy but had dealers scraping to keep their stations open, came to a close Saturday after four months of bargain prices. Many dealers hauled in their cut-rate signs Saturday and boosted the pump prices of their fuel five cents a gallon. Regular gas was selling for 32.9 cents a gallon at most stations by Saturday night and ethyl gas 3 to 5 cents higher. Spokesmen said the price war was halted when major gasoline distributors announced an end to their payment of subsidies to dealers.
