Designer Tom Douglas says he tried to make Domanoff's look like Delmonico's Restaurant at the century. He even put up temporary wallpaper with lattice and scenic designs.

Eden Studies Report Of Dead Officer.

London - U.P. - Prime Minister Anthony Eden studied Saturday official reports in the case of the young British officer who died while a captive of Egyptian guerrillas in Port Said.

The Egyptian government organ Al Goumbouria said in Cairo today 2nd Lt. Anthony Moorhouse died - apparently of suffocation - in a mental wardrobe where his captors hid him for three days after he was kidnapped Dec. 12.

But the Daily Mirror quoted a Belgian captain with the U.N. Emergency Forces as saying Moorhouse was murdered by his captors who first believed he was related to Britain's royal family, after the Anglo-Saudi withdrawal from Port Said last Saturday.

British officials refused to comment on either of the stories.

Al Goumbouria, quoting one of the guerrillas, said the officer was left Moorhouse locked in the wardrobe in a house in the Arab quarter of Port Said when the British searched the house. Moorhouse was found dead when they returned after the search had ended three days later.
