**Narcotics May Be
Involved in Kidnap
Of Marie McDonald**

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Police Chief William Parker today assigned his top intelligence squad to investigate a tip that "four or five" persons might have been involved in narcotics and extortion in the Marie McDonald kidnaping case.

The information was regarded as confidential and turned over to Parker Wednesday by District Attorney William B. McKesson. Both Parker and McKesson said the tip involves the names of individuals who previously never have been identified with the kidnaping.

McKesson said the information he placed personally in Parker's hands might involve narcotics "and/or" extortion. He would not elaborate on the tip but indicated that the 32-year-old actress might have been the victim of an extortion attempt.

Tip At Rendezvous
The district attorney said he received the tip in a secret rendezvous Tuesday night after "an acquaintance told me he knew someone who might have information on the McDonald case." He said the district attorney's office was not involved in the case.

Miss McDonald told police she was kidnaped from her \$65,000 home last Friday and left partly clad on a desert highway near Indio, Calif. She has charged that police and the press have been attempting to label her story as a hoax.

**Nobel Prize Winner
Dies in New York**

Hempstead, N.Y. — (U.P.) — Nobel prize winner Gabriela Mistral, 67, noted Chilean poet, died at Hempstead hospital today. She had been in a coma for the past seven days. Her death was caused by cancer.

Senorita Mistral won the Nobel prize for literature in 1954 and was one of the most outstanding of the Spanish language poets.

She had served her country in a diplomatic capacity as consul in Los Angeles and in posts in South America and Europe. She also was a school teacher and sociologist.

**Plane Bomber To
Die Friday Night**

Canon City, Colo. — (U.P.) — John Gilbert Graham, who killed his mother and 43 other persons by time-bombing a commercial airliner, will die in Colorado's gas chamber Friday night.

The prospect apparently does not worry him. His appetite is good. He plays cards and checks with guards, and chess with the Catholic prison chaplain who has become his closest confidante, although Graham is Protestant.

John Gibbons, one of Graham's three court-appointed attorneys, visited the 24-year-old Denver restaurant operator Wednesday. Last Sunday, Graham saw his wife, Gloria, for the last time.

Mrs. Graham said she would not return to the prison because "it's too hard on both of us." She said she does not plan to ask Gov. Stephen McNichols for executive clemency or a stay of execution. And Graham, who rejected an appeal of his death sentence, has himself made no request for mercy.

**Buenos Aires Bakes
In 103 Degree Heat**

Buenos Aires — (U.P.) — The temperature soared to a high of 103 degrees in Buenos Aires Wednesday and weathermen said the worst is yet to come. They forecast higher temperatures today and Friday.

Press Irked Over Oath Taking Ban

Washington — (U.P.) — White House news photographers Wednesday night called for reconsideration of a ban on picture coverage of President Eisenhower's private inauguration Jan. 20.

The White House Wednesday barred all press, radio and picture coverage of the private Sunday ceremony at which the President will take the actual oath of office for his second term.

Presidential Press Secretary James C. Hagerty originally had agreed to limited coverage. But he said the complete ban now was necessary because requests to cover the ceremony had "gotten out of hand."

The photographers sent Hagerty a telegram saying it "strongly" protested the ban.

"It will indeed be a sad loss to the history of our country if such an important occasion goes by without top photographic coverage," the telegram said.

It said arrangements could be worked out "by which we can adequately cover the ceremony with a small number of photographers."

**Jewish Agencies Plan
Fund Drive in States**

Vienna — (U.P.) — Jewish agencies plan a \$100 million emergency drive in the United States to aid Jewish refugees from Hungary, Egypt and North Africa, it was announced here today.

Herbert A. Friedman, executive head of the United Jewish Appeal, said the money is needed to assist thousands of Jewish refugees who seek haven in the free world.
