Ex-Sandy Police Officer Executed

McAlester, Okla.—(U.P.)—Otto Austin Loel 45-year-old former police chief at Sandy, Ore., died in the Oklahoma electric chair early today for the stabbing death of Mrs. Elizabeth Jeanne Henderson.

Loel was executed for the stabbing of the Compton, Calif., woman in an Oklahoma City motel Jan. 10, 1956.

He was strapped to the electric chair at the McAlester State Prison at 12:02 a.m., after shaking hands with Warden H. C. McLeod. The switch was thrown at 12:05 and left on for a full minute.

Loel was pronounced dead at 12:07 a.m. Asked by Warden McLeod if he had anything to say, Loel answered, "No, thank you." He entered the death cell smoking a cigarette.

Argentine Airliner Crashes on Takeoff

Buenos Aires—(U.P.)—A twin-engine Viking passenger plane of the Argentine state airline crashed and burned shortly after takeoff today. From 15 to 27 persons were reported aboard. There were only two known survivors.

The plane took off from Aeroparque airport in northern Buenos Aires on a flight to the resort city of Mar del Plata, 230 miles to the south. It failed to gain altitude and caught fire in the air.

The pilot turned his plane toward the nearby River Plate in an attempt to make a water landing and put out the flames. But he failed to clear high trees bordering a scenic drive along the river.

BURPING AUTOMOBILE London—(U.P.)—Out of gas, and petrol ration coupons, Mrs. Alice Klouda decided to try whiskey as fuel when her automobile stalled. "The car went like a bomb," she said, after driving it home without incident.

Detroit—(U.P.)—Mrs. Mary K. Barry has been placed on probation, and on a new telephone party line. Police said she assaulted a woman, with whom she shared a party line, after the woman accidentally left the phone off the hook.

Bus Line May Replace Bellrose Trolley Cars

Oak Grove—(U.P.)—Fred T. Fowler, highway engineering coordinator for the city of Portland, believes that eventually the Oregon City-Bellrose interurban streetcars should be replaced by a bus line.

He told a Public Utilities Commission hearing here yesterday on interurban passenger service that such a bus line, properly intergrated with Portland city transit system, "without question" would give the interurban area better service than streetcars.
