

Parents-Students Attend Church Series

A series of vocational conferences for high school students will start Sunday at 7:30 p.m. at the First Presbyterian church in Phoenix.

Sunday's program will include a panel that will discuss farming as a career. Panel members will include Jack Dube, agriculture instructor at Phoenix High school, John Kesler near Phoenix, and Glenn Klein, county 4-H agent. A question and answer period will follow.

Other vocations included in the series will be dentistry, engineering, police work, and medical technology.
