

Ingrid Bergman Smiles Way Through 34 Hours in U.S.

New York — (U.P.) — Ingrid Bergman was here over the week end. Sunday night she went back to Paris.

The visit lasted 34 hours. Miss Bergman came to accept the New York Film Critics Award for her role in Anastasia, but spent most of her time mending fences in film fandom.

She smiled just about the whole time, even when complaining that Americans expect-

ed her to smile too much.

Miss Bergman was smiling when the airliner that brought her here from Paris pulled to a halt at Idlewild International Airport early Saturday. She was smiling when she stepped down the ramp 15 minutes later, bundled in mink and a white babushka.

Then she beamed her way through an airport mob scene, a session with newspaper pho-

tographers, a news conference, a series of television interviews and tape recorded interviews in French, Italian and German.

"Now we need one interview in Chinese," she said.

She laughed when she said that.

During an hour of interviews at the airport, Miss Bergman answered almost every question. She left her exact age (39 to 42) a secret. She denied a rift with

her husband. She refused to comment when told a former U. S. senator who once wanted her banned from the U. S. had decided to forgive her.

Tough in Those Days

"It was pretty tough in those days," she said, smiling, "but time takes care of everything."

Had she been worried about the reception she would receive here?

"I wasn't worried," she said.

"I have never been worried about anything. If I was worried, I would be another character."

What about all the publicity she had received?

"My life is yours," she told the press.

Did she have any regrets?

"I have never regretted anything."

Had her celebrated romance with Roberto Rossellini hurt her career?

"No, not at all."

With that, Miss Bergman was off for a round of activities planned for her by the two 20th-

Lumber Demand Sinks To Three Year Low

Eugene — (U.P.) — Demand for many lumber items sank to a three year low last week and despite severely curtailed production, output still remained well ahead of the market, it was reported today.

Random Lengths, weekly lumber market letter, said that adverse weather conditions, upped freight costs and the prospect of

a curtailed housing market this year combined with the normal January slowdown to dampen the market.

Many green mills remained idle or on a curtailed basis of operation during the early part of the month but supplies still well ahead of the demand.

All new orders for sanded plywood are being booked at the \$72 index base price although some mills are still filling commitments at the \$67 base.

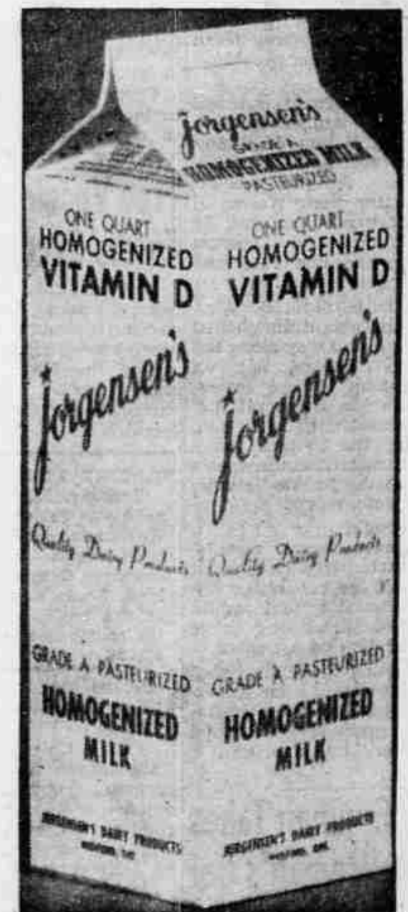
