

Students Defy Ultimatum To Stay Out of Florida Bus Integration Row

Atlanta — (UPI) — White and Negro state university student sympathizers of a Negro bus integration movement in Tallahassee, Fla., today defied an official ultimatum to stay out of the inflamed controversy.

The students who joined 600 adult Negroes at a mass rally in Tallahassee Wednesday night said they will continue their pro-integration activities "even if it means quitting school."

A Tallahassee court Wednesday set their trials for Jan. 31 following the arrests and two

visits by groups of White and Negro students to the Negro rallies, the policymaking State Board of Control announced it would consider further student participation in the integration controversy as "endangering the welfare of our universities."

Basic School Support Measure One of 35 Introduced in House

Salem — (UPI) — Increasing basic school support from \$80 to \$120 per census child was proposed in one of 35 bills dealing mostly with education and highways introduced in the Oregon House of Representatives yesterday.

Chief of the bills would authorize the commission to issue and sell \$8 million in bonds to enable the state to participate fully in the federal interstate highway program.

The school support bill which would become effective July 1 was one of three bills recommended by the School Board Association. It is also backed by Gov. Robert D. Holmes.

Shore Transfer Asked
 Another would change the state's throughway act to bring it into conformity with federal requirements. A restriction that

Control of the Pacific ocean shore would be transferred from the Highway Department to the State Land Board under a third bill. Since the administration of Gov. Oswald West, all the land between high and low tide has been classified as public highway.

Six other education bills were introduced at the request of the Interim Committee on Education.

Neuberger Offers School Aid Bill
 Washington — (UPI) — Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.), has introduced a bill for federal aid to school construction which would more than double the administration's proposal.
