Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a woman's editor and two writers. It is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Janet T.—My husband has no business sense.

Nicholas T.—We're still not in debt.

Janet T.—How much patience can a wife have with a man who has no sense at all in business affairs?

We have been married for three years and have a one-year-old baby. It seems to me that I go to work and do something about our future we'll just wind up in the poorhouse.

My husband inherited some money just before we were married. He decided to quit his job and invest in a business enterprise. He nearly got swindled and I was forced to call on my brother to ask him to straighten things out before my husband lost everything we owned.

Then, without consulting me or my brother, my husband sold his share of the business and invested in a new one, which is now floundering. Our marriage has been one long crisis. Yet my husband gets angry when I talk of going back to work.

Nicholas T.—I know I've given Jane a pretty rough time of it, but I don't think I've already become a hopeless failure. This new business still has possibilities. It's just that, every time I have a setback, Jane makes a big deal of it and reminds me that I didn't consult her or her brother before I took this step.

The fact is that I didn't consult them because I didn't like the way my brother-in-law "straightened things out" for me the last time. He has more business experience than I have, but he antagonizes people and made enemies for me when this wasn't necessary.

Although my present business enterprise hasn't been as successful as I had hoped, we are getting a living out of it. Anyway I am still young and able and I don't see why my wife should have to go to work when we have a baby at home. We're still not in debt.

The Council: Jane's hysterical behavior is driving her marriage and her husband into a desperate state. From her account it appears that she has been the failure in this marriage thus far, not her husband.

Jane seems to lack all conception of what it means to be a wife and a helpmate. When she married Nicholas and they planned to have a family, it was understood that he would undertake the role of supporter. After three years, in which Nicholas has handled this role satisfactorily enough to provide the family with a living, Jane is all set to shove him out of this position and take it on herself.

Jane has yet to prove that she can handle her own role properly. Her husband has had trouble, yet she shows no indication that she has given him any encouragement or help—other than to call in her brother. Calling for

New Delhi, India —(U.P.)— Soviet Minister of Defense Marshal Georgi Zhukov arrived today by plane for a 17-day "good will" mission to India.

Attempt Said Made To Discourage Boeing From Bay Area Site

Washington—(U.P.)—Informed sources said today the Air Force is trying to discourage Boeing Airplane Co. from establishing a new guided missile production plant in the San Francisco Bay Area.

Officially, all the Air Force would say was: "A production site for the Bomarc missile has been under consideration by Boeing Airplane Co. and the Air Force for some time. No decision has yet been made on a production site."

Air Force records, however, showed that a statement was issued in November, 1955, to the effect that the Air Force and Boeing have agreed that future production of the Bomarc missile will be accomplished in existing facilities at Wichita, Kan.

Reluctant To Build

Boeing has been reluctant to build the Bomarc, a pilotless interceptor, at Wichita since its production of the B52 bomber has been stepped up there, informed sources said.

The Air Force, on the other hand, generally opposes further concentration of weapons production in coastal areas.

Boeing has taken options on acreage in the San Ramon Valley, near Parks Air Force Base, for possible construction of a missile plant. It also has taken options on the Ford Motor Co. plant at Richmond, Calif.

The Air Force pointed out

that Boeing's own money is involved in the options and that the company obviously has a right to make such plans. It added, however, that "a formal announcement will be made when the Bomarc production site is chosen."

The Navy, meantime, denied reports published in San Francisco that it would relocate its Oak Knoll Hospital and reduce the size of its Mare Island Hospital in a "dispersal" from the Bay Area. It has no plans calling for changes in either facility, the Navy said.

The San Francisco reports also said the Army is considering moving Letterman General Hospital from the Presidio to Fort Ord.

The Army said in response to inquiries: "Even if a firm decision regarding location of Letterman Hospital has been reached within the Army staff, Army could not divulge any information until formal papers had been presented to Congress."

The office of Sen. Thomas H. Kuchel (R-Calif.) said it had been told by the army surgeon general's staff that the new federal budget "makes no provision for such a move."

"The current budget," it quoted the surgeon general's office as saying, "contemplates continuing the operation of Letterman Hospital at approximately the same level at it was last year."

'Mad Bomber' May Be Ruled Insane

New York—(U.P.)—Leading psychiatrists and legal experts felt assured today that George Metesky, the captured "mad bomber of Manhattan," will be adjudged insane and committed to a mental hospital, for his admitted planting of 34 homemade pipe bombs since 1940.

The consensus was that Metesky, the mild-mannered, amiable man "who no one ever knew," would be found incapable of understanding the charges filed against him for his crimes which injured 15 persons and spread alarm over this city.

Psychiatric tests of the 53-year-old Waterbury, Conn., bachelor, begun Wednesday at Bellevue hospital, are expected to take about three weeks. If Metesky is found insane under the law, Bellevue doctors will recommend that he be committed to a mental hospital rather than tried on the charges.

Should the Bellevue finding be challenged, however, the case presumably would develop into a battle of psychiatrists, with a New York Supreme Court judge deciding the issue. In the event of a trial, defense lawyers probably would enter a plea of innocent by reason of insanity.

Costa Rican Motorship Sinks Near San Juan

San Juan, P.R.—(U.P.)—A Costa Rican motorship sank Wednesday seven miles north of San Juan, it was reported today. Authorities said the 100-ton Edmore went down after a broken propeller shaft caused the vessel to ship water. The U.S. Coast Guard saved the four men aboard.

TV's Ralph Edwards Confined To Hospital

Hollywood—(U.P.)—Television star Ralph Edwards entered Good Samaritan hospital today for treatment of an infection that will require minor surgery. National Broadcasting Co. officials here said Edwards of the "This Is Your Life" television series will undergo the treatment for at least a week.



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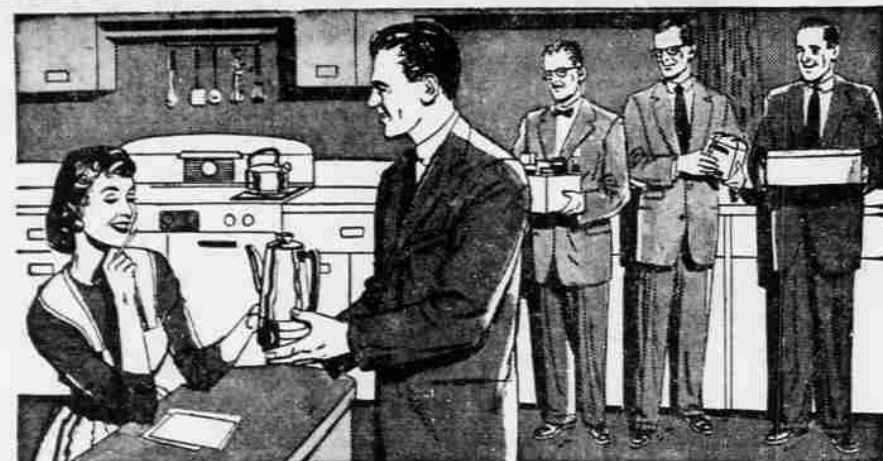
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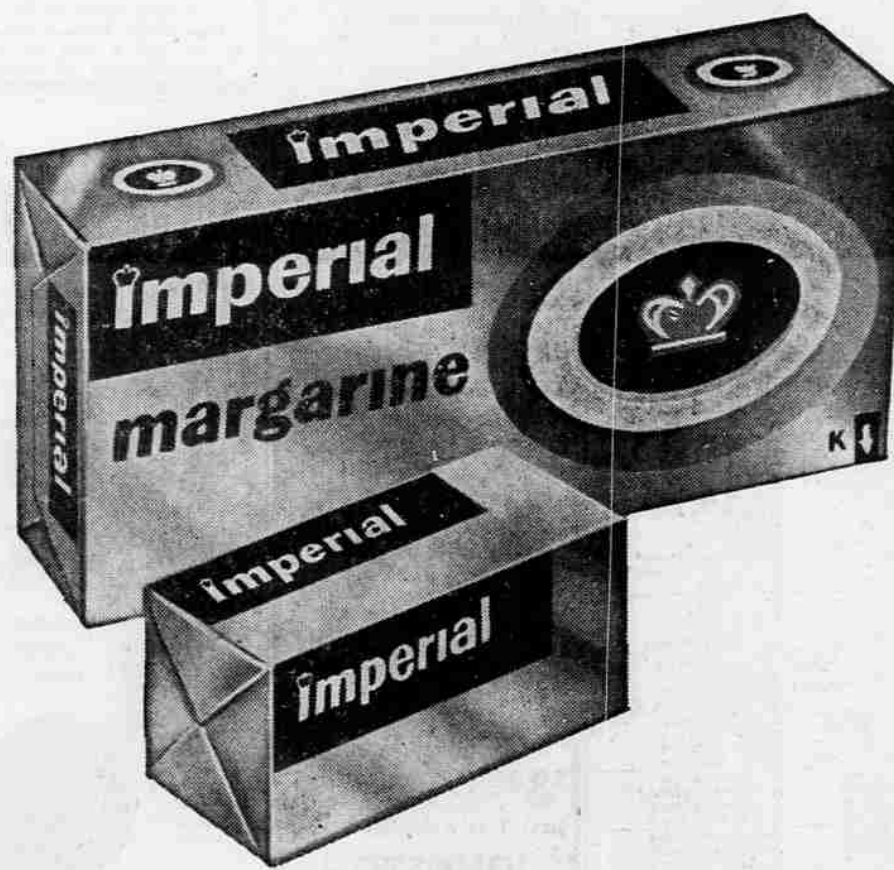
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
