Washington—President Eisenhower, answering a question as to whether he thought the Soviet attitude has been "hardening" recently:

"I couldn't really say. We are dealing with people who are rather unpredictable and, at times, they are just practically unexplicable so far as we are concerned."

Norfolk, Va.—Bob Joyn, 14, describing how he and three other teen-age boys dug a 70-pound, four-and-a-half-foot alligator out of a muskrat hole in the city park:

"We were digging about three feet down in that hole when we saw his tail wagging and I jumped out of that hole."

Washington—Rep. Clement J. Zablocki (D-Wis.) announcing that a resolution on the Middle East which Democrats wanted to offer to Congress concurrently with President Eisenhower's is not entirely dead:

"It is not a dead duck but it is not breathing very well."

Carbondale, Ill.—Daniel Pate, 50, father of former GI turn-coast Arlie Pate accepting his son's offer to "leave home within 24 hours" if he would drop an assault charge against him:
