must support herself or family for the first time, are eligible. Equipment instead of training will be made available if the applicant selected is in need of this in order to make a living, it is stated.

"Adversity often strikes suddenly, taking a wage earner from a family and making it necessary for an older woman to support herself or a family," the committee points out. "Many times such a woman meets employment barriers. If she is unable to pay for vocational training, a grant such as the one offered by Altrusa will help her."
