## Ortega, DeMarco Tussle Saturday Main Attraction

New York—(U.P.)—The week's best fight will be staged at the Boston Garden Saturday night when welterweight contenders Gaspar Ortega and Tony DeMarco clash for the third time. Their 10-rounder will be staged without benefit of television and should attract a capacity crowd. Each of their two previous bouts, won on split decisions by Mexican Ortega, were thrillers. Both fights were at Madison Square Garden, Nov. 23 and Dec. 21.

Despite those two close victories, ex-champion DeMarco of Boston is favored at 7-5 to turn the tables this time. Ortega is ranked second among 147-pound contenders; DeMarco third.

Giardello Picked  
Joey Giardello of Philadelphia, sixth-ranking middleweight contender is favored at 3-1 to beat unranked Randy Sandy of New York at the Chicago stadium, Wednesday night.

Their 10-rounder will be televised and broadcast nationally by ABC.

Young Isidro Martinez, featherweight champion of Panama, makes his Madison Square Garden debut Friday night in a 10-rounder with Bobby Courchesne of Holyoke, Mass. Neither is ranked in the top 10. Martinez made a sensational U. S. debut on Jan. 4 at Washington, D.C., where he upset ex-contender Ike Chestnut. Martinez is favored at 2-1.

Their bout will be sent over TV-radio by NBC.

## SO Conference Diamond Slate Has 16 Scuffles

Only routine or minor business was before the Southern Oregon conference session on Saturday at Crater high school.

A baseball slate with 16 games in the circuit for each school was adopted. Plans for the district wrestling tournament at Medford on Feb. 15 and 16 were outlined by Paul Evensen, Medford high coach in the sport.

A drawing for lanes for the opening race of the Rogue relay here in April were held. Lanes will be rotated for other races with the drawing serving as a basis.

It was decided to play a 16-game league basketball slate in 1958, although four of the team will have to make some adjustments aside from the usual Friday and Saturday slating in order not to run too close to state tournament time. Oregon School Activities association rules stipulated that schedules must be completed six days before state tournament opening.

The matter of having a commissioner for football officials similar to the basketball referees plan was discussed but no action taken.

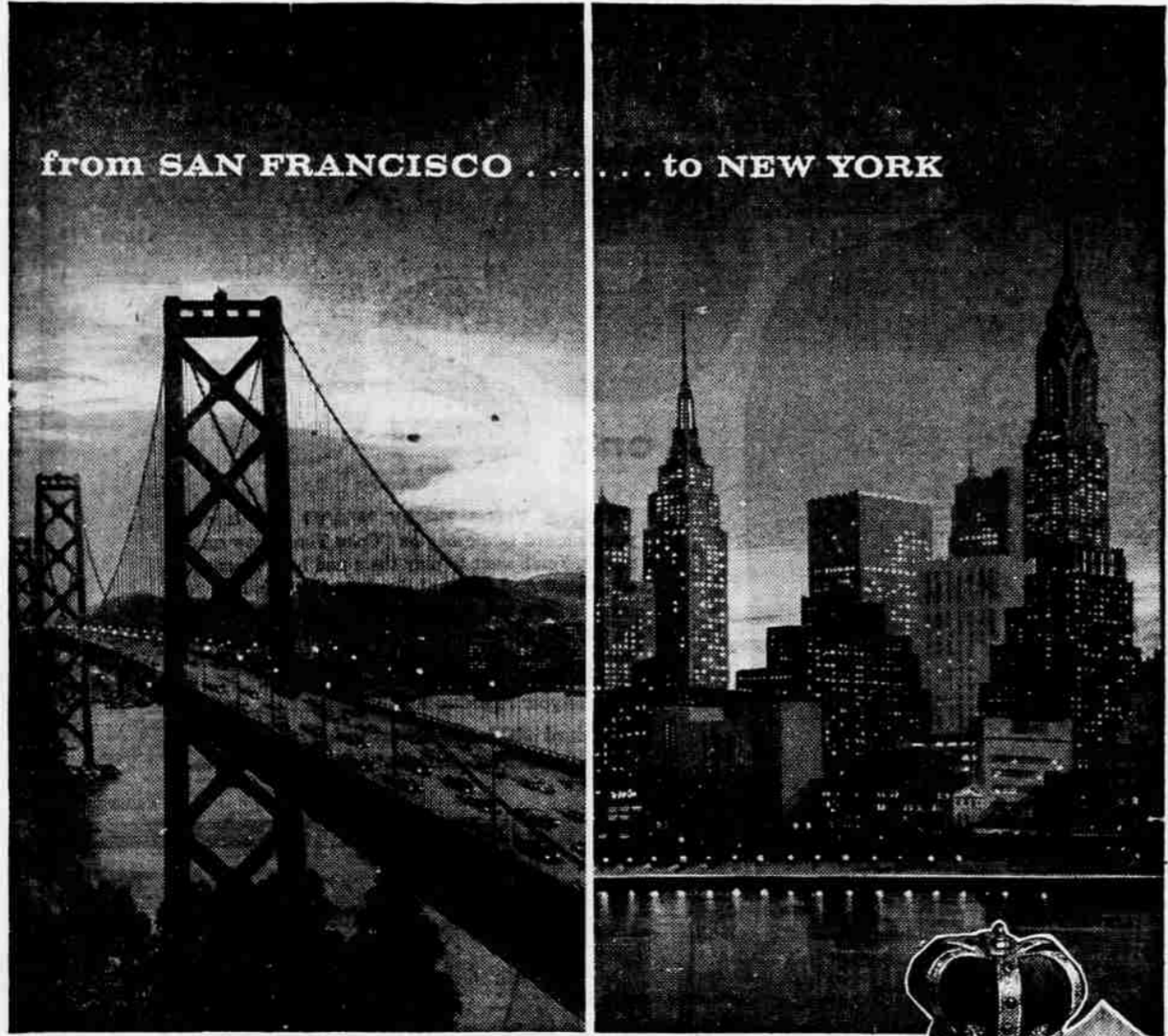
