Washington Senate Approves Compact
Olympia — (U.P.) — The Washington Senate Friday passed unanimously and sent to the House a bill approving an interstate compact re-defining the Oregon-Washington boundary on the Columbia river.
Similar legislation will be offered in the Oregon Legislature.
If both the Oregon and Washington legislatures approve the compact, the issue will be put to the voters in the form of a constitutional amendment at the next general election.
The new boundary definition was judged necessary because the course of the Columbia has changed slightly in recent years.
