woodenware was "treenware." One of America's first exports was sassafras root. In fact, the first Englishman to set foot on our New England shores was Captain Gosnell, who landed at Cape Cod in 1602, to fetch a cargo of sassafras for medicinal purposes.

The roots of the sassafras were said to have great powers of health and sassafras tea was a daily drink of the first settlers. Tales of its recuperative powers went back to England and before long sassafras root, for tea, was the New World's most valuable article of commerce.

Because the best oak in England was reserved for the Navy, early farmers built the framework for their barns and houses from old boats. Royal scouts worked daily marking every suitable oak, making it navy property by the King's mark, a broad arrow.

Building From Mayflower How does this affect us? Simply that the Mayflower is reported to have been sold in England in 1624 by permission of the British Admiralty, for the equivalent of about \$500. The wood went to a Buckingham farmer named William Russell for building his barn. There it stands now, states Sloane, seasoned by the salt of the famous voyage, a building made entirely from the historic Mayflower.
