

Protestants Seek \$11,500,000 For '57 Overseas Aid

New York, N. Y.—More than \$11,500,000 will be asked of Protestant church-goers in America in 1957 to aid the homeless, hungry and destitute abroad.

Announcement of this goal for the 1957 United Appeal for Overseas Relief and Reconstruction—highest in the history of the churches—was made recently by Harper Sibley, chairman of Church World Service.

The 1957 relief program, Sibley said, exceeds that of last year by nearly three-quarters of a million dollars.

Church World Service, the cooperative agency through which the major denominations administer world-wide programs of assistance to millions of those in distress in other lands, is a major department of the National Council of Churches.

Highlight of the 1957 united appeal, Sibley said, will be the "One Great Hour of Sharing" observances on Sunday, March 31. On that day special services will be held in thousands of American churches in emphasis of the Protestant overseas ministry. A major portion of the funds necessary for the 1957 program will be raised through special relief offerings at this time.

The 1957 "One Great Hour of Sharing"—united appeal is the ninth annual cooperative effort of the denominations working together in ministry to overseas need.

The new responsibility of the churches for resettlement and other assistance to Hungarian and other refugees from oppression and the continuing world-wide free distribution of surplus American foodstuffs, Sibley said, are major items of the total schedule.

Major areas of need overseas which will be aided through the "One Great Hour of Sharing"—united appeal include Austria and Hungary, India, Pakistan, Korea, the Near East, Japan, Greece, Germany, France, Italy, Hong Kong and Indonesia.

Part of the funds raised will finance processing, shipping and overseas distribution of clothing donated through Service Centers as well as the overseas distribution of foods collected by the Church World Service Christian Rural Overseas Program (CROP).

Also supported through the United Appeal, both in individual denominational and inter-denominational efforts are long term health and nutrition programs, self-help projects, vocational training and other ministries to the homeless and destitute.

All of the overseas assistance given, Sibley said, entirely on a basis of need, without any question of race, color or creed.
