

Redfield-Johnson Duo Sets C Doubles Mark In State Pin Tussle

Edith Redfield, Medford, and Judy Johnson, McMinnville, smashed the record in Class C doubles by 50 pins as they took over the lead in that event Saturday in the Oregon State Women's Bowling association tournament.

The duo tabulated a 1043 count in the event, cracking the mark of 993 by Kay Krohn and LaVonne Dill, Medford, in the 1956 rivalry. It was the first record-busting accomplishment in the four-week ends of the six week end competition at Medford Bowling lanes.

Mrs. Redfield also went into

C all-events leadership with a 1508, which is 10 pins under the record and 117 better than the score of the previous leader. She rolled a 331 which was good for second spot in C singles. In doubles she carded a 552 and her partner from McMinnville 491. On the opening week end of the tourney Mrs. Redfield had a 425 for Davis Transfer of Medford.

The new record doubles tabulation exceeded by 102 pins the 941 by this tourney's former C leaders Juanita Banta and Grace Counts, Sweet Home. Mrs. Redfield's 1508 compares to the 1391 of Wilma Russell, McMinnville, who held the lead until Saturday and the 1518 all-time tourney high registered by Donna Sandberg, Rockaway in 1955.

John Landy To Retire

Melbourne, Australia — (U.P.) — World champion miler John Landy Saturday announced his retirement from major athletic competition.

"I've had it," gasped Landy after finishing second to Geoff Fleming in an 880-yard club event at Olympic park.

Landy holds the world record in the mile event with the time of 3:55 minutes at Turku, Finland, June 21, 1954.

Gresham, Hillsboro, Klamath Falls, Milwaukie and Springfield each placed three men in the semi-finals.

Paul Larson Signs Pact with Cardinals

Chicago — (U.P.) — Paul Larson, a former University of California quarterback who three years ago set a National collegiate pass completion record, has signed a 1957 contract with the Chicago Cardinals.

Larson was the Cardinals' eighth draft choice in 1954 and was selected before he finished his college career. That season he hit 64.1 per cent of his passes. He completed 125 of 195 attempts for 1,537 yards and ten touchdowns.

The Philippine pair earlier beat Britain's Billy Knight and Mike Davies, 10-12, 6-4, 10-8, 3-6, 6-2, in the semi-finals.

Miss Gibson, teaming up with Drobny, won the mixed doubles title earlier in the tournament.

Washington Upsets Bears; Oregon, OSC Lose Friday

A couple of big men from Washington gave the "unbeaten" boys from California a basketball lesson Friday night that made the Pacific Coast conference race tighter than treading pants.

While Doug Smart and Bruno Boin were leading the Huskies to a 70-57 victory over the Bears, UCLA swamped Oregon, 81-62, to move into a first place tie with

California, and Washington was only a step behind the leaders.

In other games, Southern California defeated Stanford, 72-69, and Idaho trimmed Oregon State, 74-67, making league standings: California 10-1, UCLA 10-1, Washington 11-2, Southern California 5-4, Stanford 6-7, Washington State 4-8, Idaho 3-10, Oregon State 2-8, Oregon 1-10.

Two Team Race
The California Basketball association narrowed down to a two team race, and just barely. The University of San Francisco held the lead by rolling over Pepperdine, 86-66, while St. Mary's stayed on its heels by ending San Jose State, 67-66, in a disputed contest. Loyola badly damaged Santa Clara's hopes by upsetting the Broncos, 58-57.

The CBA standings were: USF 9-2, St. Mary's 8-2, Santa Clara 7-4, San Jose State 7-5, Loyola 4-6, Fresno State 4-6, College of Pacific 2-8, and Pepperdine 1-9.

California, ranked ninth nationally with the best defensive record in the country, dropped from its undefeated conference perch like a rock. Doug Smart, Washington's sensational 6-7 sophomore, led the whole Cal team, 20-19, at halftime, and the other Huskies had added 12 points for good measure.

Smart led scorers with 28 points while Boin (6-8) had 25.

Realignment in Major Leagues May Leave Every Team In Separate Cities; Majors May Move West

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The prospect of major league baseball coming to California within the next year or two took on a rosy hue today—but the matter of procedure still is open for conjecture.

With the Brooklyn club now owning the Los Angeles franchise in the Pacific Coast league, the way was open for a transfer of "Dem Bums" to this state.

But would the National league go for a one-stop swing through the west?

"The general line of thinking in the majors now is to have one team in each city," says Phil Wrigley, president of the Cubs.

Plan Suggested
Along with that idea, here is a possibility suggested by a man connected with the PCL.

1—Brooklyn will move to Los Angeles and the New York Giants to the Minneapolis-St. Paul stadium by 1960, for the two "western" National league clubs.

2—The Boston Red Sox will sell the San Francisco franchise in the PCL to the Chicago White Sox. That would be the only change necessary in the American league, as it already has a "jumping off" place for the west coast at Kansas City, Mo.

This realignment would make every city in both leagues a "one-team" city.

However, it would eliminate the possibility of a great rivalry series between San Francisco and Los Angeles, because they would be in different leagues.

Los Angeles has a trade area of 5,000,000, San Francisco of about 3,000,000.

The possibility is broached because it is doubtful that the American league is going to turn the California gravy over to the National league in toto.

Eddie Mulligan, president of the Class C California league and a former major leaguer and PCL president, suggests this possibility:
