## The Medical Roundup

### Nervousness As A Cause Of Disease

Since I wrote in this column about the many illnesses which can be produced by nervousness, a number of persons have told me of a miserable experience they had with someone who told them that their trouble was nervous in origin when definitely or assumedly, it was "organic" in nature. Most of the persons were bitter, and I sympathized deeply with them. Unfortunately, we physicians—being human—are fallible and subject to making mistakes; I am sure I must have made many, and will doubtless make more.

One woman told me that when, suddenly, in her 50's, she developed a pain in her abdomen, the physicians who first saw her assumed that that her distress was of nervous origin and did not even examine her. If they had been better trained or not so busy, they would have been much impressed by the fact that the woman had never before complained of anything, and had never been ill or even nervous.

Whenever a person past 40 or 50 comes with a story of a lifetime of good health, and then a brand new illness coming suddenly, I am worried, and so nearly certain that there must be some serious disease at work that I keep hunting until I either find it or have to give up. Then sometimes I am sure there is something seriously wrong in the abdomen that I ask a surgeon to operate and look for it. In all but a few cases of this type in my experience he has found definite disease that was causing the pain and perhaps the ill health and loss of weight. In cases like that of the woman who wrote I am never satisfied with the diagnosis of nerves. Sometimes a doctor will hazard a diagnosis of allergy, but again, this is most unlikely because we get our allergies in our youth; not in our later years.

### Nerves Blamed

But, to get back to the problem of the woman; her abdomen was x-rayed—I don't know how thoroughly—and again she was told that since nothing had shown up, her troubles must be due to nerves. Much later, when more definite symptoms appeared, she was examined again, and a cancer of the bowel was found. In extension of the mistake, I will say that one of the tragedies of medicine is that many cancers inside the body grow so slowly and insidiously that by the time they start to produce symptoms they have scattered, and little can be done. Also, in some locations, such as the pancreas (a big digestive gland back of the stomach), x-rays can not show a growing cancer.

Others of my correspondents who are now angry with one or more physicians for having called their disease a neurosis may or may not be justified. It is true that later another physician or surgeon diagnosed "organic" disease and apparently worked a cure by some treatment. But this means nothing to a well-trained and widely-experienced

### Woman Becomes Angry

To illustrate how we doctors are often puzzled; years ago I saw a neurotic-looking woman who was evidently having storms of some kind. Like many persons, she hated what she felt was the stigma of being called nervous, and hence, when I asked her to let me have an electroencephalogram made and to have a consultation with a psychiatrist she walked out on me, too angry to say goodbye. Later, she wrote me a scathing letter to say that I was a fool. She had gone to a man who was an enthusiast on Brucellosis, and he had delighted her by telling her that that was her trouble and that all of her doctors had missed it. Six months later she wrote me another bitter letter to say that when the treatment for Brucellosis had done no good, she had gone to another enthusiast—this one on amebiasis—and he had found amebiasis (a dysentery-producing single-celled parasite) in her bowel. He was sure they were causing all her trouble. Again, she wanted me to know that I was an ignoramus who ought to go back to school and learn my business.

### Dilantin Ends Spell

Still later, her husband, tired of a year of very expensive treatments that had not stopped her curious spells and nervous storms, brought her back to me. This time I had the electroencephalogram made which showed clearly that what she had was a fit-less type of epilepsy, like a grandfather and uncle before her had had. To our great joy, a few doses each of Dilantin wiped out the spells, and more remarkable yet, took away this really lovely woman's former tendency to take violent dislikes to many people and to attack them verbally with abuse. As she told me later, this behavior of hers had always distressed and worried her; she had had it from childhood and she had always been ashamed of it.
