Washington—Israeli Ambassador Abba Eban on efforts to end the deadlock on Israel's withdrawal from Egyptian territory: "I think we have broken through."

Boeing Plans To Make Missiles at Seattle

Seattle — (U.P.) — Boeing Airplane Co. has announced it will utilize its existing production facilities here for presently programmed manufacturing on the Bomarc guided missile.

Boeing said it decided to make the Bomarc here at the Air Force request.

The Bomarc program involves a board network of subcontractors and suppliers with limited support from Boeing's Wichita division, a company spokesman said. The Wichita facility is now heavily occupied with B52 bomber production.

The Bomarc is a ground to air missile designed to seek out and destroy enemy planes far from their intended targets.
