The Medical Roundup

When I see a young man in medicine, I always wonder the reason for gallstones because I had been taught to do. But as I grew older and saw hundreds of persons with perfectly silent gallstones which never bothered them, and when I saw at county hospitals that persons who died of a pneumonia or a heart attack or a stroke had had harmless gallstones for most of their life, I lost my enthusiasm for operations. Today I advise operations only when the patient is getting colics and having a lot of pain or flatulence or abdominal distress. Sometimes when a man or woman has heart disease of a certain type with trouble with the gallbladder, the removal of this organ brings great relief, not only in the abdomen, but also in the region of the heart as well.

I used to be influenced by the worry many physicians have as to the possibility that gallstones might eventually produce cancer of the gallbladder. But since I have read insurance statistics showing that among the hundreds of gallstone-carrying people who were insured years ago the final mortality has been only some 1.4 per cent higher than in

Youths Collect \$3,293.37 for TAP

Crater High school at Central Point turned in \$1,227.56 in the recent Teens Against Polio campaign, it has been announced by Nancy Adams, county TAP chairman. Ike, Mollet Agree On Peaceful Solution

Washington (UPI)—President Eisenhower and French Premier Guy Mollet agreed yesterday that a solution to the Middle East problem can be achieved by peaceful means.

Mr. Eisenhower and the French Premier issued a joint communique as Mollet concluded his Washington visit and left for New York.

They also pledged continued support for the early reunification of Germany by means of free elections and agreed that European defense forces should be maintained with conventional armaments and "modern weapons" at such levels and balance "as to discourage any aggression against the territories of all NATO countries."

Welfare Commission Will Ask More Funds

Portland (UPI)—The State Welfare Commission met here yesterday and said it would ask the Legislature for a budget increase of \$6.5 million over the previous biennium.

The commission said its 1957-59 budget request would total \$75,725,606. It forecast a 1959-61 budget of \$82,246,972.
