

Phoenix High, Glide Contend This Evening in 6 A-2 Hoop Decider; 'Cats Win Saturday

Phoenix and Glide High schools collide at 8 p.m. today on the Roseburg high court in the third and deciding game in their play-off for the District 6 A-2 basketball championship and a spot in state tournament play at Salem.

The series was extended to the full three games when Glide's Wildcats clawed the Pirates 64 to 47 at Glide on Saturday night. Phoenix won the opener 55 to 48 in Medford on Thursday.

Hot shooting and the stellar combinations of the cousins Smith, Dick and Allen, were big factors in the Saturday victory. The Wildcats pulled a switch on the Phoenixians. They ran away from the Pirates in the first half. On Thursday it was the Phoenix team which had taken the lead in the first two stan-

das. In the opener of the two-of-three series Glide came back in the second half and bid strong to overtake the Pirates. Phoenix could muster no such threat on Saturday although it met the Wildcats on more than even scoring terms in the last two quarters.

In the second half Phoenix turned to a "zone press" defense and offensively outscored the Douglas county quint 31 to 30.

Agreement Clears Way For Games

Sacramento — (U.P.) — A tentative agreement has been reached by the state and private landholders which would clear the way for the winter Olympics at Squaw Valley in 1960 and make a permanent state park out of the site when the games are over.

The agreement, reached Friday, involved purchase by the state of about 32 acres of land from Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Poul-

sen, majority landholders of property between the state highway and the inland site of the games.

Meeting Arranged

He said the land purchased from the Poulsons, if the agreement holds up, would give the state 502 acre in the high Sierra valley to hold the winter games and would provide a total of 1,400 acres for post games
