Eyes Students in Mirror
At home he teaches flat on his back encased in a steel chamber eyeing his students like a flinty New England schoolmaster in a mirror over his head.
At the lecture hall in San Francisco he wears a portable chest-abdominal respirator when speaking to the class. Electricaly powered, the "lung" pulls air out of the cylinder causing his chest to swell and making his breathing easier.
