JEFFERSON TOPS MALIN IN B CAGE TOURNAMENT

Medford — (U.P.) — The State Class B high school basketball tournament rolled into its semi-final round here today with the defending champion and one of the pre-tourney favorites already out of the running.

85 Athletes Prepping for Cinder Slate

Medford High school athletes will aim for a fifth straight state track championship for the Black Tornado this year and 85 candidates who aspire for assignments in the effort are now working out.

Current turnout includes two 1956 state champions, a 1955 state titlist and four other members of last year's state meet squad. Two other members of the titular team, one a state champ and the other a runner-up, are still out for basketball.

Jerry Close and Wally Larson, who won the broad jump and low hurdles, respectively, in the A-1 state meet last season, head the list of those now conditioning for the thirteenth sport. Larson was state runner-up in the high hurdles.

Among the other top candidates, members of the state meet squad in 1956, are Eldon Francis, state javelin winner in 1955, Mike Russell, third last year in the state quarter-mile, Pete Kershaw and Loren Christean, relay team members, and Les Lingsch, half-miler, who won the prep AAU crown last spring. The squad also includes Johnny Jones, AAU junior sprint champion.

More Things Done
Bilbee Lane, who won the half-mile in the state meet last year, and Neil Plumley, who was runner-up in the shot put, are still with the basketball squad.

Coach Bob Newland reported that the squad "has done more things for this time of year than ever before." Newland has just switched his attention from junior varsity basketball to varsity track. He has previously set up a training schedule for the track and field men. The talent on hand and Newland's indication concerning the fine attitude of the squad pictures a bright outlook for the 1957 season.

A time trial meet with Crater and Ashland will be held here on March 30, opening the season. The Rogue relays follow here on April 7.

Duck Stars Billed
Jim Bailey, the Australian, who was first to run the mile in under four minutes in the United States, and Bill Dellinger, national 5,000 meter champ, may run here in exhibition at the relay. It depends for Bailey on the status of his conditioning. He's back for another year at University of Oregon. Dellinger, ex-UC star, is back at the university in a reserve officers training corps capacity.

It is also planned to have a UO distance medley team here made up of mostly ex-Medford high runners, Dan Morris in the quarter, Wiley Winchell in the half-mile and Bruce Kelington in the three-fourths mile. Newland said that rubber is being collected to mix with asphalt for all weather paving of the vaulting and jumping pits. It is hoped by next year to have a similarly paved all weather track inside the present cinder oval at the stadium.

O'Leary, Fetchik Lead Pensacola

Pensacola, Fla. — (U.P.) — Paul O'Leary and Mike Fetchik, who between them haven't earned the price of a first place pot on the winter golf circuit, today led the field into the second round of the \$15,000 Pensacola Open.

O'Leary, of Bismarck, N.D., a long hitter seeking his first win on the winter tour although he has been a pro for eight of his 28 years, eased home six birdies Thursday for a four-under-par 68 over the Pensacola Country Club Course. He has picked up \$987 in tournaments this year.

Fetchik, of Mahopac, N.Y., winner of three major tournaments last year but with only a \$547 total to show in 1957, picked up eight birdies to match O'Leary at 68.

E. Baylor Unanimous Choice for All-Coast

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The accent was on defense on the 1957 United Press All-Coast basketball team announced today with five different teams represented on the first club—but with the great sophomore, Elgin Baylor of Seattle University, being a unanimous choice for the squad.

Baylor, the West's leading scorer and one of the tops in the nation, headed the first team; and another sophomore, Doug Smart of University of Washington also made it.

The other three men are Larry Friend, California; Mike Farmer, USA; and Dick Banton, UCLA.

Not High in Scoring
This club was chosen mostly for its great defensive abilities and as a unit it doesn't rank high on scoring ability, although it could hold its own in most company.

Only Baylor is a standout in the scoring department, with a 30-point average.

But defensively it is one of the best of all-time. Young Smart led the Pacific Coast conference in rebounds; Friend was a defensive standout for the Cal team that goes to the NCAA play-offs; Farmer stood out in the same department for the USA team that also goes to the play-offs; Banton was the speedster in the Bruin defense; and Baylor led his team to a berth in the National Invitational

North Carolina, West Virginia Advance Toward NCAA Tourney

A record-busting scoring spree by Lennie Rosenbluth and a care-free clowning show by Hot Rod Hundley sent North Carolina and West Virginia surging closer today to the only two berths remaining in the NCAA basketball tournament.

Yale became the 21st team in the 23-team carnival Thursday night when it inherited the Ivy league championship as runner-up Dartmouth lost to Harvard, 69-60.

North Carolina, the nation's No. 1 team, is expected to win the Atlantic Coast conference tournament and qualify for an NCAA game against Yale in New York next Tuesday. And, led by Rosenbluth, the Tar Heels easily won their opening ACC game Thursday night, 81-61, over Clemson.

Len Score 45 Points
Rosenbluth's 45 points eclipsed a 41-point effort earlier in the day by Grady Wallace, South Carolina's national scoring leader, and set two ACC tourney records — for points in a single game, and 19 baskets in one game. What's more, the All-American from New York City
