### Journal Says Schrunk Innocent of Bribe

Portland — (U.P.) — The Oregon Journal said here today that it had wired Sen. John L. McClellan (D-Ark.) that it had uncovered evidence indicating Mayor Terry Schrunk is innocent of underworld charges he accepted a bribe.

The newspaper said its own investigators had unearthed evidence clearing Schrunk and that the information was sent to the chairman of the Senate Labor Rackets Committee. Schrunk in Washington, D.C. today denied that he took a \$500 bribe from a gambler and offered to take a lie detector test. James B. Elkins, self-confessed Portland racketeer, had testified that gambler Clifford O. Bennett told him he paid Schrunk \$500 to prevent a raid on his 8212 club.
