## 1,226,000 Board Feet of Timber Sold at Auction

About 1,226,000 board feet of U. S. national forest timber was sold Friday to three bidders at a timber sale in the Rogue River National Forest office at the Medford post office, according to Jack Woods, forest supervisor.

The first sale included 36,000 board feet in the Larson homestead area of the Union Creek ranger district to James Vanderlip, Shady Cove. His bid was \$12,198.50.

Lower bids were submitted by Duane Burton, Butte Falls; CM and D Logging company, Trail; Crater Logging company, Prospect; Eugene Burrill, Medford; John Wheeler, Medford; and G and R Logging company, Medford. Appraised value of the timber was \$9,757.

Appraised value of timber near south road No. 3 in the Union Creek ranger district was sold to the CM and D logging company. Their bid was \$11,378.50. Appraised value of the timber was \$9,596.

Other bids were submitted by James Vanderlip, G and R Logging company, Crater Logging company and Duane Burton. Trail Creek Lumber company, Inc., Medford, purchased 900,000 board feet of timber near north road No. 3 in the Union Creek ranger district on a bid of \$33,980. Appraised value of the timber was \$21,658.

Lower bids were submitted by the G and R Logging company, Louis Biden, Medford; CM and D Logging company, James Vanderlip and Eugene Burrill.

## AF Discontinues Plans for Air Base

Salem—(U.P.)—The Air Force has definitely discontinued plans for establishing a new air base in the greater Portland area, Gov. Robert D. Holmes was informed by the secretary of the Air Force Friday.

Official confirmation of the Air Force plans came in answer to a telegram from Gov. Holmes who had advised the secretary of Oregon's interest in 400 acres of land located on the proposed site of the base 15 miles north of Salem. The state cancelled plans to build an intermediate institution there when the Air Force announced its base plans.

Gov. Holmes said John J. Winn Jr., general manager of the Port of Portland, which has jurisdiction of the Portland airport, will go to Washington next week to confer with congressional and Air Force officials on plans for expanding the Portland base.

The governor, as chairman of the State Board of Control, indicated the state might take legal action to recover "out-of-pocket" expenses incurred by the state as the result of the Air Force change of plans.

## News Briefs

### RAISE POSSIBILITY

Washington — (U.P.)—Congressional critics were reported Saturday that Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson's controversial decision on missiles could leave the nation without a robot weapon in the 200-to-1000 mile range.

The army, now barred by Wilson from developing guided missiles with more than 200-mile range, was said to be encouraged by the congressional development and hopeful that it can retrieve some of the missile responsibility it lost to the air force in November.

### URGES REST

Washington — (U.P.)—Senate Democratic Whip Mike Mansfield Saturday urged President Eisenhower to take an immediate rest in the sun to avoid endangering "his health and our security."

### LEAVE NEW YORK

United Nations, N. Y. — (U.P.)—Delegates to the 11th General Assembly left New York for their homes around the world Saturday with orders to report back immediately if the Hungarian or Middle East situations erupted again.

They left Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld with the responsibility of working toward a permanent Middle East settlement now that Britain, France and Israel all have withdrawn their troops from Egypt.

### SHIP, BOAT COLLIDE

New York — (U.P.)—A 150-foot coastal tanker sliced through a motor launch and rammed an anchored freighter in New York harbor Friday night.

The skipper of the 40-foot launch was killed. No one aboard the tanker or freighter was injured.

The victim of the collision, Thomas P. O'Rourke, 60, a retired New York policeman, was the only one aboard the launch which had just pulled alongside the freighter Steel Admiral to take on a liberty party.

Johannesburg, South Africa — (U.P.)—Some 400 policemen patrolled the Daveyton Township Saturday to guard against further tribal fighting that has killed 12 persons and wounded at least 74 others in two days.

More than 12,000 residents evacuated the township Friday night to escape the fighting which erupted between the Swazi and Kosa tribal groups after a child was stabbed to death in the Swazi area. The Zulu group sided with the Swazi Friday.

### NAMED PRESIDENT

San Francisco — (U.P.)—The Western Pine association concluded its annual four-day convention Saturday with the election of A. B. Hood, Anderson, Calif., as president.

### DROPPES PLANS

Jakarta — (U.P.)—The military revolt in eastern Indonesia has forced President Sukarno to drop plans to seat Communists in a new "mutual help" cabinet Jakarta newspapers reported Saturday.

### MAD BOMBER

Paris — (U.P.)—A mild mannered "mad bomber" who blew up an apartment house was found hanged beneath a Seine River bridge Friday night with a note in his pocket saying, "I detest society."

### PATROL STREETS

Milan, Italy — (U.P.)—Police, patrolled Milan streets Friday night to prevent another outburst of Thursday's carnival rioting that climaxed with a teenage band stripping a screaming 19 year old girl nude on a main thoroughfare.

## Norblad Says Navy Not Planning Site

Washington—(U.P.)—Rep. Walter Norblad said Friday that he had been informed by the Navy department that it definitely does not plan development of a naval air reserve facility in the greater Portland area.

Norblad had asked the Navy department to make clear its intentions in light of the Air Force's recent cancellation of plans to build a multi-million dollar base in the Woodburn area which the Navy would have shared.

Prior to its plans to share the proposed Woodburn facility, the Navy had indicated an interest in building a reserve training facility at Hillsboro airport.

Norblad quoted a Navy department official as saying, "At the present time no requirements for the Hillsboro site is foreseen." The announcement was taken to mean that the present naval training facility at Salem will continue as the only such base in the Portland area.

## FHA Sets Up Plan To Aid Flood Area

Boise — (U.P.)—The Federal Housing Administration has set up special loan terms to aid owners of flood-damaged homes in Baker, Malheur, Union and Wallowa counties in eastern Oregon, Berne Jensen, regional FHA director here said today.

Jensen said persons who had suffered home loss or damage during the floods which hit the area the last part of February could borrow up to \$12,000 with no down payment.

The FHA director said the loans could be made by banks or other lenders who are approved by the FHA. He said the loans could be repaid in monthly installments over as much as 30 years.
