Hunt for Lost Dog Brings Death To Two

Ocala, Fla. — (UPI) — The bodies of two young Negro brothers were found late Wednesday night in the bottom of a murky lagoon where they were drowned while searching for their lost dog.

Leon Bostic, 9, and his brother, Alfred, 7, disappeared Tuesday afternoon after school on the hunt for the lost dog. Authorities drained the lagoon and found the bodies in a mud hole in one of the deep sections of the waterway.

Anglo-American Alliance Criticized

London — (UPI) — Britain's Conservative party political center published a pamphlet criticizing the Anglo-American alliance today less than a week before Prime Minister Harold Macmillan meets President Eisenhower in Bermuda.

"The average Englishman may find it difficult to believe that any country which has to call out armed soldiers to escort six Negro children to a white high school could believe itself ordained to lead the Afro-Asian block at the United Nations," the pamphlet said.

Its author Philip Goodhart, is a Tory candidate for Parliament. His father is an American citizen.

Labor Consultant Attempts Suicide

Los Angeles — (UPI) — Labor relations expert Leo Kotin, 48, whose wife is secretary to Teamsters Union President Dave Beck, was given emergency treatment Wednesday after what police listed as an apparent suicide attempt because he couldn't "compete" with Mrs. Kotin's career.

Officers said they found Kotin on the floor of his gas-filled apartment after receiving a telephone call from Mrs. Kotin in Washington, who had just talked to her husband by phone. They quoted her as saying she feared her husband might kill himself.

Officers said several gas outlets were open in the apartment. They said they found a note reading:

Contractors Told To 'Sharpen Pencils' in Federal Project Bids

Washington — (UPI) — The Eisenhower administration has warned today that rising construction costs may force the government to cut back some of its public works projects.

The warning was issued by W. A. Dexeimer, commissioner of reclamation, in a speech prepared for delivery to the 38th convention of the Associated General Contractors of America.

Dexeimer told the contractors to "sharpen your pencils" and cut profit margins or "you may kill the goose that lays the golden egg."

Dexeimer said a bid opening is scheduled in April for the 700-foot high concrete arch dam at Glen Canyon on the Colorado river in northern Arizona. This is expected to be the costliest single contract in U.S. reclamation history.

Klamath Resources Purchase Study Seen

Washington — (UPI) — A study of possible legislation to provide government purchase of the most valuable resources of the Klamath Indian tribe will be launched soon by a Senate subcommittee headed by Sen. Richard Neuberger.

Neuberger said that the problem could now be taken in light of the Senate's passage last week of a bill delaying termination of federal control over the tribe until mid-1958.

The Oregon senator said that the "primary duty of Congress now is to see to it that the Northwest's finest stand of Ponderosa pine timber is not exploited or gutted." He said this may be accomplished by government purchase for sustained-yield custodianship.

Modern Lady Godiva Protests Theater Tax

London — (UPI) — An unemployed young blonde actress rode into Piccadilly Circus Wednesday wearing only a pair of shorts in protest against Britain's entertainment tax.

"I decided that for my last performance I would make them take notice," Geraldine Haigh, 22, said. "Lady Godiva did it to stop an unfair tax and so did I."

The tax has discouraged theater patrons and closed many of the theaters, including the one in which Miss Haigh worked.
